



Vote YES on House Bill 2015

Over the last 10 years, we've heard from countless families that the ability to apply for a license to drive is a core, everyday need. The ability to drive legally is vital for many Oregonians as they take their kids to school, commute to work, and contribute to their communities. Without the ability to apply for a license to drive, parents are forced to make impossible choices.

Between 80,000-100,000 Oregon residents could benefit from driver license expansion. The new requirements for Real ID will create barriers for many. Under HB 2015, all drivers who pass a knowledge exam, vision test, driver's test and provide proof of identity and residency will be eligible for a standard driver's license, and can choose it over the more expensive, enhanced Real ID driver's license. The proposed bill will positively impact many Oregonians, particularly the elderly, immigrants without legal status, low income individuals, those born in other states, people who are houseless, victims of domestic violence, and victims of natural disasters.

At the end of the day, this issue is about who we are as Oregonians. In Oregon we believe in treating others as we would want to be treated and looking out for our neighbors.

These values are held in our broad coalition of House Bill 2015 endorsers where business, labor, community, and faith are standing together.

We encourage you to pass House Bill 2015.

Facts

- Currently, 13 states, including California and Washington, issue licenses to drive to all drivers who meet the legal, safety, insurance, identification, and residency requirements to obtain a license, regardless of immigration or citizenship status. Oregon has proven models to work from.
- Multiple university and government studies have shown that in states with policies like the one Oregon is proposing, traffic accidents and hit-and-run incidents have decreased by as much as 10% ¹to 30%² and the number of insured driver rates have increased significantly, making roads safer and saving millions in out-of-pocket expenses for drivers who are not at fault.
