**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:**

Eliminates requirement that certificate to practice cosmetology include the practitioner's address.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Safety concern of having home address displayed
- Allowed practice of covering address on displayed certificate
- Unique license number distinguishes between practitioners with common name
- Whether employees and independent contractors are equally subject to requirement to display certificate

**EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:**

The Oregon Health Licensing Office issues certificates to qualifying applicants who wish to provide cosmetology services to the public. These services include hair design, barbering, esthetics, nail technology, and natural hair care. Oregon administrative rule 817.035.0110 requires that the certificate be posted in public view. Oregon statute requires that the practitioner's address be on the certificate.

As a matter of safety and privacy, some practitioners are not comfortable having customers and the public know their home address.

House Bill 2749 eliminates the requirement that the certificate to practice cosmetology include the practitioner's address.
