WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Directs state agencies to follow Childhood and Early Parenting Principles as framework for policies and programs on early parenting and childhood development.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Importance of prenatal care and health of child during stages of development
- Interest in amending the Resolution to be more inclusive

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

The Childhood Early Parenting Principles (CEPP) were developed by organizations working on the delivery of child health and early childhood development. They focus on ages 3 to 5 due to the impact on a child's future physical and mental health. CEPP extends the work of early childhood development to the prenatal period of child development, and includes both physical and mental development.
