Measure Description:

Directs Department of Administrative Services to enter into contract with a nonprofit organization to create a trauma-informed practice integration program in collaboration with public and private entities that serve children, adolescents and families.

Analysis:

HB 2969 appropriates \$325,000 General Fund to the Department of Administrative Services (DAS) to contract with a nonprofit organization to create a trauma-informed practice integration program in coordination and collaboration with public and private entities that serve children, adolescents and families, including the Department of Human Services (DHS), the Oregon Youth Authority (OYA), the Department of Education (ODE), the Oregon Health Authority (OHA), the Department of Corrections (DOC), the Department of Justice (DOJ), the Criminal Justice Commission (CJC), the Oregon Judicial Department (OJD), the Youth Council, nonprofit organizations, district attorneys, school districts, county public health programs, and state and local law enforcement agencies. The measure takes effect July 1, 2019.

Department of Administrative Services (DAS)

DAS will use existing staff and resources to develop a request for proposals and manage the contract required by the measure.
