WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Modifies definition of "public library" to be public agency that provides to all residents of a local government free and equal access to library and information services that are suitable for persons of all ages. Requires State Library Board to establish minimum conditions for public libraries that includes financial support from public funds and regular open hours and to provide reasonable exemptions to libraries with service populations of 2,000 or fewer residents.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Need for library standards to support small, rural libraries
- Benefits of developing modern library services to serve current community needs
- Need for amendments to clarify Board's rulemaking requirements

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

Defines public library as public agency that provides to all residents of a local government free and equal access to library and information services that are suitable for persons of all ages. Replaces requirement for State Library Board to take into account library's service population with requirement to provide reasonable exemptions to libraries with service populations of 2,000 or fewer residents.

BACKGROUND:

Current statute finds that: 1) an informed citizenry is indispensable to the proper function of a democratic society; 2) libraries constitute a cultural, informational, and educational resource essential to Oregonians; and, 3) library services should be widely available throughout the state to bring Oregonians convenient opportunities for reading, study, and free inquiry. To achieve the statutory goal of convenient library access, the Oregon State Library is required to promote the establishment, development, and support of local library services, including library services for children and youth and Oregonians who are print-disabled. The Oregon State Library Board sets strategic plans and policies for the State Library and adopts rules to carry out the purposes of the State Library.

House Bill 2243-A amends the definition of "public library" to a public agency that provides to all residents of a local government free and equal access to library and information services that are suitable for persons of all ages, and requires the State Library Board to establish minimum conditions that a public library must meet, including at least standards for public financial support and regularly scheduled open hours. Any standards adopted by the Board must provide reasonable exemptions to libraries with service populations of 2,000 or fewer residents.
