### SUMMARY

Establishes Improving People's Access to Community-based Treatment, Supports and Services Program administered by Improving People's Access to Community-based Treatment, Supports and Services Grant Review Committee established in Oregon Criminal Justice Commission. Specifies that purpose of program is to provide grants to counties and Oregon's federally recognized Indian tribes to establish evidence-based programs to provide comprehensive community supports and services to individuals with mental health or substance use disorders and reduce individuals' involvement in criminal justice system, decrease hospitalizations and decrease institutional placements. Specifies membership, duties and authority of committee.

Requires committee to administer program in which counties, federally recognized Indian tribes or regional consortia of counties or Indian tribes may apply for state funds for comprehensive community supports and services.

Permits committee and Oregon Health Authority to work together to include coordinated care organizations in Improving People's Access to Community-based Treatment, Supports and Services Program in way that provides incentives to coordinated care organizations to provide comprehensive community supports and services to reduce involvement in criminal justice system by members of coordinated care organization whose inadequately treated mental illnesses or substance use disorders are primary drivers of members' involvement in criminal justice system.

Requires Improving People's Access to Community-based Treatment, Supports and Services Grant Review Committee to appoint subcommittee to explore policy areas for further discussion during 2020 regular session of Legislative Assembly.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

### OPEN GOVERNMENT IMPACT

Legislative Counsel has not adopted standards for drafting measures that establish exemptions from disclosure of public records.

This measure exempts from public disclosure data containing personally identifiable information received by the quality improvement subcommittee of the Improving People's Access to Community-based Treatment, Supports and Services Grant Review Committee.

If those public records that could be subject to public disclosure were instead subject to mandatory disclosure under public records law, the public could receive personally identifiable information of individuals needing or receiving mental health or substance abuse supports and services.
