SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Requires each community college and public university to ensure that course description for every academic course offered in succeeding academic term lists all textbooks enrolled students are required to purchase. Creates limited exceptions.]

Requires each community college and public university to establish textbook affordability plan. States required elements of plan. Requires at least one student representative to be involved in developing plan.

3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2019 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 348.748 to
5	348.757.
6	SECTION 2. (1) Each community college and public university listed in ORS 352.002 shall
7	establish a textbook affordability plan. Each plan established under this section shall:
8	(a) Contain measurable goals for increasing textbook affordability, such as:
9	(A) Establishing a target amount of student savings that will result from adoption of the
10	plan; or
11	(B) Requiring that a certain number of courses offered by the community college or
12	public university be designated as using low-cost or no-cost course materials under ORS
13	348.757.
14	(b) Address how to best mitigate the economic impact of decreased academic bookstore
15	revenue as a result of the increased adoption of low-cost or no-cost open educational re-
16	sources.
17	(c) Set forth the steps the community college or public university will take to advertise
18	the availability of academic courses designated as using low-cost or no-cost course materials
19	under ORS 348.757.
20	(d) Contain a statement of support for the academic freedom of faculty and instructors
21	to select high-quality course materials for courses taught by the faculty and instructors.
22	(e) Establish a process for faculty and instructors to be informed about available low-cost
23	and no-cost course materials.
24	(2) At least one student representative must be included and consulted in the develop-
25	ment of each textbook affordability plan established under subsection (1) of this section.

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
