(1) The Youth Development Council is established. 17 "(2) The council is established for the purpose of [overseeing] coordinating a unified and 18 aligned system that provides services to school-age children through youth 24 years of age in a 19 manner that supports educational success, focuses on crime prevention, reduces high risk behaviors 20 and is integrated, measurable and accountable. The council shall provide direction to the Youth 21**Development Division.** 22"(3) The council consists of no fewer than 15 members who are appointed by the Governor. The Governor shall ensure that membership of the council satisfies any federal requirements for mem-2324 bership of a state advisory committee on juvenile justice, and shall include tribal representation in 25the membership of the council. 26 "(4) The council shall: 27"(a) Determine the availability of funding to support community-based youth development pro-28grams, services and initiatives with demonstrated outcomes and strategic objectives established by 29the council by rule. 30 "(b) Prioritize funding for services related to: 31 "(A) The prevention of and intervention in the risk factors that lead to juvenile delinquency and 32the promotion of protective factors that improve the health and well-being of children and youth, 33 as supported by evidence-based program models and other research-based models; and 34 "(B) The prevention of and intervention in gang violence and gang involvement. 35 "(5) The council may:

1 "(a) Enter into performance-based intergovernmental agreements with regional and county enti-2 ties, and tribal governments, to contract for the provision of youth development programs, services 3 and initiatives that will achieve demonstrated outcomes and strategic objectives established by the 4 council by rule.

5 "(b) Determine the means by which services to children and youth may be provided effectively 6 and efficiently across multiple programs to improve the academic and social outcomes of children 7 and youth.

"(c) Assess state programs and services related to youth development and training, and identify
methods by which programs and services may be [coordinated or consolidated] aligned or unified.

"(d) Establish common academic and social indicators to support attainment of goals establishedby the council.

"(e) Establish common program outcome measurements and coordinate data collection acrossmultiple programs and services.

14 "(f) Ensure implementation of best practices that:

15 "(A) Are evidence based;

16 "(B) Are culturally, gender and age appropriate;

17 "(C) Address individual risk factors;

18 "(D) Build upon factors that improve the health and well-being of children and youth; and

19 "(E) Include tribal best practices.

"(6) The Governor may designate one member of the council to serve as the chairperson or, if the Governor chooses not to designate a chairperson, the council may elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.

"(7) In accordance with applicable provisions of ORS chapter 183, the council may adopt rules
 necessary for the administration of the laws that the council is charged with administering.".

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
