

House Bill 2319

Sponsored by Representative LIVELY; Representative DOHERTY (Pre-session filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires public or private safety agency to display message listing 9-1-1 emergency number on websites or printed materials that list contact phone number for agency and are intended for general public use, viewing or distribution.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to listing of emergency number; amending ORS 403.115.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 403.115 is amended to read:

5 403.115. (1) The primary emergency telephone number within this state is 9-1-1, but a public or
6 private safety agency shall maintain both a separate 10-digit secondary emergency number for use
7 by a telephone operator or provider and a separate 10-digit nonemergency number.

8 (2) Every public [*and*] **or** private safety agency in this state shall participate in the emergency
9 communications system.

10 (3)(a) An emergency telephone number other than 9-1-1 may not be published on the top three-
11 quarters of the emergency listing page of a telephone book. However, an alternative nonemergency
12 telephone number for a 9-1-1 jurisdiction may be printed on the top three-quarters of the emergency
13 listing page of a telephone book. The publisher may use the remainder of the page to list the Oregon
14 Poison Center, Federal Bureau of Investigation, a designated mental health crises service and
15 United States Coast Guard, where applicable. If there is more than one mental health crises service
16 in a jurisdiction, the local health department shall decide which mental health crises service the
17 publisher may list by using the criteria of a 24-hour staffed service, nonprofit organization and
18 non-9-1-1 participating agency. The publisher shall refer to the community services section for other
19 numbers.

20 **(b) A public or private safety agency shall display the words "For emergencies, dial**
21 **9-1-1" or a substantially similar message on websites or printed materials that:**

22 **(A) List one or more phone numbers for contacting the public or private safety agency;**
23 **and**

24 **(B) Are intended for general public use, viewing or distribution.**

25 (4) The emergency communications system must provide:

26 (a) Interconnectivity between public safety answering points and interconnectivity with provid-
27 ers of the same or similar emergency response services nationally;

28 (b) The capability, within each primary public safety answering point, to receive all emergency
29 calls placed locally within each 9-1-1 service area; and

30 (c) The automatic location identification accurately portraying the location from which each
31 emergency call originates.

NOTE: Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [*italic and bracketed*] is existing law to be omitted.
New sections are in **boldfaced** type.
