

## HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2321

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “192.511” insert a comma.

2 In line 3, delete “and 312.030” and insert “312.030 and 802.250”.

3 On page 9, after line 25, insert:

4 “**SECTION 4.** ORS 802.250 is amended to read:

5 “802.250. (1) An eligible public employee may request that any driver or vehicle record kept by  
6 the Department of Transportation that contains or is required to contain the eligible employee’s  
7 residence address contain instead the address of the public agency employing the eligible employee.  
8 A request under this section shall:

9 “(a) Be in a form specified by the department that provides for verification of the eligible  
10 employee’s employment.

11 “(b) Contain verification by the employing public agency of the eligible employee’s employment  
12 with the public agency.

13 “(2) Upon receipt of a request and verification under subsection (1) of this section, the depart-  
14 ment shall remove the eligible employee’s residence address from its records, if necessary, and sub-  
15 stitute therefor the address of the public agency employing the eligible employee. The department  
16 shall indicate on the records that the address shown is an employment address. While the request  
17 is in effect, the eligible employee may enter the address of the public agency employing the eligible  
18 employee on any driver or vehicle form issued by the department that requires an address.

19 “(3) A public agency that verifies an eligible employee’s employment under subsection (1) of this  
20 section shall notify the department within 30 days if the eligible employee ceases to be employed  
21 by the public agency. The eligible employee shall notify the department of a change of address as  
22 provided in ORS 803.220 or 807.560.

23 “(4) If an eligible employee is killed in the line of duty, a person who is a household member  
24 of the eligible employee may request that any driver or vehicle record kept by the department that  
25 contains or is required to contain the household member’s residence address continue to contain the  
26 address of the public agency that employed the eligible employee for up to four years after the date  
27 of the death of the eligible employee. On or before the date on which the four-year period ends, the  
28 household member shall notify the department of a change of address as provided in ORS 803.220  
29 or 807.560. A request under this subsection shall be in a form specified by the department.

30 “(5) As used in this section, ‘eligible employee’ means:

31 “(a) A member of the State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision.

32 “(b) The Director of the Department of Corrections and an employee of an institution defined  
33 in ORS 421.005 as Department of Corrections institutions, whose duties, as assigned by the super-  
34 intendent, include the custody of persons committed to the custody of or transferred to the institu-  
35 tion.

1 “(c) A parole and probation officer employed by the Department of Corrections and an employee  
2 of the Department of Corrections Release Center whose duties, as assigned by the Chief of the Re-  
3 lease Center, include the custody of persons committed to the custody of or transferred to the Re-  
4 lease Center.

5 “(d) A police officer appointed under ORS 276.021 or 276.023.

6 “(e) An employee of the State Department of Agriculture who is classified as a brand inspector  
7 by the Director of Agriculture.

8 “(f) An investigator of the Criminal Justice Division of the Department of Justice.

9 “(g) A corrections officer as defined in ORS 181A.355.

10 “(h) A federal officer. As used in this paragraph, ‘federal officer’ means a special agent or law  
11 enforcement officer employed by:

12 “(A) The Federal Bureau of Investigation;

13 “(B) The United States Secret Service;

14 “(C) The United States Citizenship and Immigration Services;

15 “(D) The United States Marshals Service;

16 “(E) The Drug Enforcement Administration;

17 “(F) The United States Postal Service;

18 “(G) The United States Customs and Border Protection;

19 “(H) The United States General Services Administration;

20 “(I) The United States Department of Agriculture;

21 “(J) The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives;

22 “(K) The Internal Revenue Service;

23 “(L) The United States Department of the Interior; or

24 “(M) Any federal agency if the person is empowered to effect an arrest with or without warrant  
25 for violations of the United States Code and is authorized to carry firearms in the performance of  
26 duty.

27 “(i) An employee of the Department of Human Services or the Oregon Health Authority whose  
28 duties include personal contact with clients or patients of the department or the authority.

29 “(j) Any judge of a court of this state.

30 “(k) An employee of the Oregon Youth Authority **or of a county juvenile department** whose  
31 duties include personal contact with persons committed to the legal or physical custody of the au-  
32 thority **or of the county juvenile department**.

33 “(L) A district attorney, as defined in ORS 131.005, or deputy district attorney.

34 “(m) An employee who provides educational services to persons who are clients or patients of  
35 the Department of Human Services or the Oregon Health Authority, who are under the jurisdiction  
36 of the Psychiatric Security Review Board or who are under the custody or supervision of the De-  
37 partment of Corrections, the State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision, a community cor-  
38 rections agency, the Oregon Youth Authority or a juvenile department. As used in this paragraph,  
39 ‘employee who provides educational services’ means a person who provides instruction, or services  
40 related to the instruction, of a subject usually taught in an elementary school, a secondary school  
41 or a community college or who provides special education and related services in other than a  
42 school setting and who works for:

43 “(A) An education service district or a community college district; or

44 “(B) A state officer, board, commission, bureau, department or division in the executive branch  
45 of state government that provides educational services.

1 “(n) An employee of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission who is:  
2 “(A) A regulatory specialist; or  
3 “(B) A regulatory manager.  
4 “(o) A police officer as defined in ORS 801.395.  
5 “(p) An employee whose duties include personal contact with criminal offenders and who is  
6 employed by a law enforcement unit, as defined in ORS 181A.355.  
7 “(q) A civil code enforcement officer, as defined in ORS 192.345.”  
8 In line 26, delete “4” and insert “5”.  
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
