House Bill 2509

Sponsored by Representatives PILUSO, SOLLMAN; Representatives NOSSE, SANCHEZ (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Prohibits use of single-use checkout bags except in certain cases. Allows Department of Environmental Quality to impose civil penalty of not more than \$250 per day. Repeals statute requiring retail establishments that offer plastic bags to customers to also offer paper bags.

| 3 | Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: |
| 4 | SECTION 1. As used in this section and section 2 of this 2019 Act: |
| 5 | (1) "Recycled paper checkout bag" means a paper bag made by a manufacturer whose |
| 6 | total production of paper checkout bags in the preceding calendar year averaged at least 40 |
| 7 | percent recycled fiber. |
| 8 | (2)(a) "Retail establishment" means any store in this state that sells or offers for sale |
| 9 | goods at retail. |
| 10 | (b) "Retail establishment" does not mean an establishment where the primary business |
| 11 | is the preparation of food or drink: |
| 12 | (A) For consumption by the public; |
| 13 | (B) In a form or quantity that is consumable then and there, whether or not it is con- |
| 14 | sumed within the confines of the place where prepared; or |
| 15 | (C) In consumable form for consumption outside the place where prepared. |
| 16 | (3) "Reusable checkout bag" means a bag with handles that is specifically designed and |
| 17 | manufactured for multiple reuse and is made of: |
| 18 | (a) Cloth or other machine-washable fabric; or |
| 19 | (b) Durable plastic that is at least 2.25 mils thick. |
| 20 | (4)(a) "Single-use checkout bag" means a bag made of paper, plastic or any other mate- |
| 21 | rial that is provided by a retail establishment to a customer at the time of checkout, and |
| 22 | that is not a recycled paper checkout bag or a reusable checkout bag. |
| 23 | (b) "Single-use checkout bag" does not mean a bag made of paper, plastic or any other |
| 24 | material that is provided by a retail establishment to a customer at a time other than the |
| 25 | time of checkout. |
| 26 | SECTION 2. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, a retail establishment |
| 27 | may not provide single-use checkout bags to customers. |
| 28 | (2) A retail establishment may: |
| 29 | (a) Make reusable checkout bags available for sale to customers. |
| 30 | (b) Provide reusable checkout bags at no cost to customers. |
| 31 | (c) Provide recycled paper checkout bags at no cost to: |
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| 1 | (A) Customers who use a voucher issued under the Women, Infants and Children Pro- |
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| 2 | gram established under ORS 413.500. |
| 3 | (B) Customers who use an electronic benefits transfer card issued by the Department |
| 4 | of Human Services. |
| 5 | (d) Provide recycled paper checkout bags to customers if the retail establishment charges |
| 6 | not less than 10 cents for each recycled paper checkout bag. |
| 7 | (e) Provide single-use checkout bags to customers for items marked with protected |
| 8 | health information or other confidential information. |
| 9 | (f) Provide single-use checkout bags at no cost to customers for fresh meat or seafood, |
| 10 | if the retail establishment packs the fresh meat or seafood in ice. |
| 11 | (3) The Environmental Quality Commission may adopt rules necessary to implement |
| 12 | sections 1, 2 and 3 of this 2019 Act. |
| 13 | (4) The Department of Environmental Quality may require a retail establishment to |
| 14 | provide, within a reasonable time, information necessary to ensure compliance with this |
| 15 | section. |
| 16 | SECTION 3. (1) The Department of Environmental Quality may impose a civil penalty on |
| 17 | a person for a violation of section 2 of this 2019 Act. |
| 18 | (2) A civil penalty imposed under this section may not exceed \$250 per day. |
| 19 | (3) Civil penalties described in this section shall be imposed in the manner provided in |
| 20 | ORS 183.745. |
| 21 | (4) All penalties recovered under this section shall be paid into the State Treasury and |
| 22 | credited to the General Fund and are available for general governmental expenses. |
| 23 | SECTION 4. ORS 459A.695 is repealed. |
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
