32 "(4) Prior to final adoption of a proposed update, the State Department of F	
33 Wildlife shall prepare a report on implementation of the update, including but not lin	
34 information concerning changes in the number of high priority wildlife corridors esta	
35 or planned. The State Department of Fish and Wildlife shall post the report on the	depart-

1 ment website and deliver the report to Senate and House interim or regular committees re-

"<u>SECTION 2.</u> All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed
to assist and advise the State Department of Fish and Wildlife in the development of the
Wildlife Corridor Action Plan and in the five-year reviews of the plan required under section
1 of this 2019 Act.

⁷ "<u>SECTION 3.</u> The State Department of Fish and Wildlife shall initiate work on the ⁸ Wildlife Corridor Action Plan no later than January 1, 2020, and report department findings ⁹ and recommendations regarding the designation and protection of wildlife corridors to in-¹⁰ terim or regular Senate and House committees relating to natural resources in the manner ¹¹ provided by ORS 192.245 no later than September 15, 2022.

12 "<u>SECTION 4.</u> (1) The Department of Transportation shall establish a program to reduce 13 wildlife-vehicle collisions in areas where wildlife corridors identified in the Wildlife Corridor 14 Action Plan by the State Department of Fish and Wildlife intersect with proposed or existing 15 public roads. The program shall include, but need not be limited to, plans for creating or 16 modifying road infrastructure in a manner that reduces wildlife-vehicle collisions and pro-17 motes public safety. The plans may include but need not be limited to the use of wildlife 18 crossing structures and roadway fencing.

"(2) To the extent practicable, the Department of Transportation shall coordinate with
local governments, as defined in ORS 174.116, and the tribal governments for tribes and
bands listed under ORS 172.110, to achieve the goals of the program described in this section.
<u>SECTION 5.</u> (1) The Department of Transportation shall establish the program required
under section 4 of this 2019 Act no later than December 31, 2023.

"(2) Until the Department of Transportation establishes the program, the Department of Transportation and the State Department of Fish and Wildlife shall coordinate efforts to reduce wildlife-vehicle collisions based on the data gathered under section 1 of this 2019 Act. The Department of Transportation shall consider the benefit of including a wildlife crossing as part of a project if the data suggests that such a crossing could significantly reduce wildlife-vehicle collisions.

30 "(3) The Department of Transportation shall report biennially regarding the status of the 31 program required under section 4 of this 2019 Act to interim or regular Senate and House 32 committees relating to natural resources in the manner provided by ORS 192.245. The report 33 shall include, but not be limited to, information concerning the number and types of wildlife 34 corridor infrastructure projects established or planned and the realized or expected effect 35 of established or planned wildlife corridor infrastructure projects on the number of wildlife-36 vehicle collisions.

37 "<u>SECTION 6.</u> The Department of Transportation shall submit the first report required
 38 under section 5 (3) of this 2019 Act no later than September 15, 2024.".

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
