# House Bill 2941

Sponsored by Representative ALONSO LEON; Representatives HERNANDEZ, NOSSE, Senators DEMBROW, GELSER, MANNING JR, WAGNER

### SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to require each mental health provider preparation program in this state to prepare plan to recruit and graduate diverse mental health providers.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to mental health provider diversity; amending ORS 342.433, 342.447 and 350.100.

### **3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 342.433 is amended to read:

- 5 342.433. As used in ORS 342.433 to 342.449 and 350.100:
- 6 (1) "Diverse" means culturally or linguistically diverse characteristics of a person, including:
- 7 (a) Origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa but is not Hispanic;

8 (b) Hispanic culture or origin, regardless of race;

- 9 (c) Origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, the Indian subconti-
- 10 nent or the Pacific Islands;

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- (d) Origins in any of the original peoples of North America, including American Indians orAlaskan Natives; or
- 13 (e) A first language that is not English.
- 14 (2) "Educator" means a teacher or an administrator.
- 15 (3) "Mental health provider" means:
- 16 (a) A psychologist licensed under ORS 675.010 to 675.150;
- 17 (b) A clinical social worker licensed under ORS 675.530; and
- (c) A professional counselor or marriage and family therapist licensed under ORS 675.715.
   SECTION 2. ORS 342.447 is amended to read:

342.447. (1) The Higher Education Coordinating Commission shall require each public educator
 preparation program in this state to prepare a plan with specific goals, strategies and deadlines for
 the recruitment, admission, retention and graduation of diverse educators to accomplish the goal
 described in ORS 342.437.

(2) The commission shall require each mental health provider preparation program in
 this state to prepare a plan with specific goals, strategies and deadlines for the recruitment,
 admission, retention and graduation of diverse mental health providers.

- [(2)] (3) The commission shall review the plans for adequacy and feasibility with the governing
   board of each public university with an educator preparation program or a mental health provider
   preparation program and, after necessary revisions are made, shall adopt the plans.

1 (a) The contents of the plans;

2 (b) The commission's initial and biennial review process, including timetables for revising plans;

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(c) Other matters necessary for carrying out the provisions of ORS 342.433 to 342.449 and 350.100.

6 SECTION 3. ORS 350.100 is amended to read:

350.100. (1) The Higher Education Coordinating Commission and the Chief Education Office shall
ensure the implementation of the plans developed under ORS 342.447 for recruitment of diverse educators and mental health providers.

10 (2) The commission and the office shall report biennially to the Legislative Assembly on the 11 implementation and results of the plans. The report may include recommendations on ways in which 12 the Legislative Assembly can assist in increasing the number of diverse educators **and mental** 

13 health providers.

14 <u>SECTION 4.</u> ORS 350.100, as amended by section 75a, chapter 774, Oregon Laws 2015, is 15 amended to read:

350.100. (1) The Higher Education Coordinating Commission shall ensure the implementation of
the plans developed under ORS 342.447 for recruitment of diverse educators and mental health
providers.

(2) The commission shall report biennially to the Legislative Assembly on the implementation
 and results of the plans. The report may include recommendations on ways in which the Legislative
 Assembly can assist in increasing the number of diverse educators and mental health providers.
