House Bill 2985

Sponsored by Representative MCLAIN

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Directs State Board of Education to adopt by rule standards for provision of occupational therapy to students who have individualized education programs. Becomes operative July 1, 2020.

1 A BILL FOR AN ACT 2 Relating to the provision of occupational therapy to students. Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3 SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2019 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 343. 4 **SECTION 2.** (1) As used in this section: 5 (a) "Occupational therapist" has the meaning given that term in ORS 675.210. 6 7 (b) "Occupational therapy" includes: 8 (A) Improving, developing or restoring functions that were impaired or lost through illness, injury or deprivation; 9 (B) Improving a child's ability to perform tasks for independent functioning if functions 10 11 are impaired or lost; and (C) Preventing, through early intervention, initial or further impairment or loss of 12 13function. (c) "Occupational therapy assistant" has the meaning given that term in ORS 675.210. 14 (2) The State Board of Education, in consultation with the Occupational Therapy Li-15 censing Board, shall adopt by rule standards for the provision of occupational therapy to 16 17children who have an individualized education program. The standards must: (a) Allow occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants to provide services 18 19 to children who have an individualized education program and to serve as a member of a 20 child's individualized education program team. 21(b) Identify requirements for occupational therapists to supervise occupational therapy 22assistants who are providing services to children who have an individualized education pro-23gram. (c) Establish limits on the number of children to whom an occupational therapist or oc-2425cupational therapy assistant may provide services. In establishing limits under this para-26 graph, the State Board of Education must take into consideration: (A) The severity of the needs of the children served by the occupational therapist or oc-27 cupational therapy assistant; 28 29 (B) The level and frequency of services necessary to satisfy the requirements of an individualized education program; 30 (C) The amount of time required to plan services; 31

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1 (D) The amount of time required to conduct evaluations of a child, including classroom 2 observations;

3 (E) The amount of time required to coordinate services provided under the individualized
4 education program with other service providers;

(F) The amount of time required for professional development;

6 (G) The amount of time required for further monitoring, observation, treatment or co-7 ordination of services following the completion of the provision of services; and

8 (H) The amount of time required to travel between schools or locations served by the 9 occupational therapist or the occupational therapy assistant.

10 SECTION 3. (1) Section 2 of this 2019 Act becomes operative on July 1, 2020.

11 (2) The State Board of Education may adopt rules or take any action before July 1, 2020,

that is necessary for the board to exercise all of the duties, functions and powers conferred on the board by section 2 of this 2019 Act.

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
