(1) The Public Utility Commission shall establish a public process for the 3 purpose of investigating the continuing relevance of the carrier of last resort obligations provided for under ORS 759.500 to 759.570. The investigation shall focus on whether develop-4 $\mathbf{5}$ ing industry trends, technologies and policy drivers in the telecommunications sector impact the existing regulatory system administered by the commission for ensuring adequate and 6 7 reasonable access for residential customers to telecommunications service in all areas of this 8 state. 9 "(2) As part of the public process established under subsection (1) of this section, the 10 commission shall investigate changes to the existing regulatory system and incentives that 11 could accommodate developing industry trends and support new policy objectives without 12 compromising residential customers' access to reliable and safe service at just and reason-13 able prices in an adequate and nondiscriminatory manner. The investigation required by this 14 subsection shall specifically focus on: 15"(a) Customers whose individual circumstances and needs may impact their access to and 16 usage of telecommunications services, including low-income customers; 17 "(b) Residential customers with access at their domicile to fewer than two of the fol-18 lowing terrestrial-based service alternatives: "(A) Telecommunications services provided by a facilities-based competitive local ex-19 20 change carrier; 21"(B) Voice service offered via interconnected Voice over Internet Protocol; or "(C) Voice service offered by a cellular communications service; and 22"(c) The comparability of voice service offered by wireless Internet service providers and 2324 satellite providers. 25"(3) If the commission determines that changes to the existing regulatory system and incentives would be in the interest of residential customers and the public generally, the 2627commission shall develop plans to administratively implement changes to the regulatory 28system and incentives within its existing statutory authority or shall make recommendations 29 to the Legislative Assembly for the purpose of legislatively implementing changes to the 30 regulatory system and incentives. 31 "(4) As part of the public process established under subsection (1) of this section, the 32commission shall: "(a) Solicit input from: 33 "(A) All telephony providers, including telecommunications utilities, cooperative corpo-34 35rations and municipalities certified by the commission to provide local exchange telecom-

- 2 "(B) The Citizens' Utility Board;
- 3 "(C) Residents of, or groups who represent, residents of rural areas of this state;
- 4 "(D) Advocates for low income persons; and
- 5 "(E) Senior citizens; and

6 **"(b) Provide the public with an opportunity to comment.**

7 "(5) The commission shall submit a report on the findings of the public process estab-

8 lished under subsection (1) of this section and the progress of investigations conducted under

9 subsection (2) of this section in the manner provided by ORS 192.245 to the interim commit-

tees of the Legislative Assembly related to economic development and business and general government no later than September 15, 2020. The commission may include, as part of the
