

# House Bill 3290

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY (at the request of Representative Jeff Barker)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study convictions. Requires report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary.

Sunset January 2, 2020.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

1  
2 Relating to convictions; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission shall study convictions in this**  
5 **state. The commission shall submit findings and recommendations for legislation to an in-**  
6 **terim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary no later than December**  
7 **31, 2019.**

8 **SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2019 Act is repealed on January 2, 2020.**

9 **SECTION 3. This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**  
10 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect**  
11 **on its passage.**
