- 10 "(3) Expenditures from the Self-Insured Employer Group Adjustment Reserve;

"(4) Expenditures from the Consumer and Business Services Fund for payment of contracted collection costs, including contracted processing costs for the Combined Payroll Tax Reporting System and workers' compensation paying agent reimbursements as described in ORS 656.307;

"(5) Expenditures from the Funeral and Cemetery Consumer Protection Trust Fund; and
"(6) Special payments to Oregon Health and Science University for research on occupa tional illness and disease.

¹⁸ "<u>SECTION 7.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by chapter 372, section 1 (4), Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Department of Consumer and Business Services, for the Central Services Division, is reduced by \$803,245.

24 "<u>SECTION 8.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on 25 expenditures established by chapter 372, section 2 (2), Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium 26 ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Department of 27 Consumer and Business Services from the Health Insurance Exchange Fund established by 28 ORS 741.102, for the Central Services Division, is increased by \$803,245.
