On page 11 of the printed bill, delete lines 28 through 45 and delete pages 12 and 13. 1 2 On page 14, delete lines 1 through 3 and insert: "SECTION 7. ORS 427.005 is amended to read: 3 "427.005. As used in this chapter: 4 5 "(1) 'Adaptive behavior' means the effectiveness or degree with which an individual meets the standards of personal independence and social responsibility expected for age and cultural group. 6 7 "(2) 'Care' means: 8 "(a) Supportive services, including, but not limited to, provision of room and board; 9 "(b) Supervision; 10 "(c) Protection; and 11 "(d) Assistance in bathing, dressing, grooming, eating, management of money, transportation or 12 recreation. 13 "(3) 'Community developmental disabilities program director' means the director of an entity that provides services described in ORS 430.664 to persons with intellectual disabilities or other 14 15developmental disabilities. 16 "(4) 'Developmental disability' means [an intellectual disability,] autism, cerebral palsy, epilepsy 17 or other [neurological] condition diagnosed by a qualified professional that: 18 "(a) Originates before an individual is 22 years of age[, or 18 years of age for an intellectual 19 disability;] 20 "[(b) Originates in and directly affects the brain] and is expected to continue indefinitely; 21(c) (b) Results in a significant impairment in adaptive behavior as measured by a qualified 22professional; 23 "[(d)] (c) Is not attributed primarily to other conditions including, but not limited to, a mental 24 or emotional disorder, sensory impairment, substance abuse, personality disorder, learning disability 25or attention deficit hyperactivity disorder; and 26"[(e)] (d) Requires [training and support] supports similar to [that] those required by an indi-27vidual with an intellectual disability. 28"(5) 'Director of the facility' means the person in charge of care, treatment and training pro-29grams at a facility. "(6) 'Facility' means a group home, activity center, community mental health clinic or other fa-30 31 cility or program that the Department of Human Services approves to provide necessary services 32to persons with intellectual disabilities or other developmental disabilities. 33 "(7) 'Incapacitated' means a person is unable, without assistance, to properly manage or take care of personal affairs, including but not limited to financial and medical decision-making, or is 34 35incapable, without assistance, of self-care.

1 "(8) 'Independence' means the extent to which persons with intellectual disabilities or other 2 developmental disabilities exert control and choice over their own lives.

3 "(9) 'Integration' means:

4 "(a) Use by persons with intellectual disabilities or other developmental disabilities of the same 5 community resources that are used by and available to other persons;

6 "(b) Participation by persons with intellectual disabilities or other developmental disabilities in 7 the same community activities in which persons without disabilities participate, together with reg-8 ular contact with persons without disabilities; and

9 "(c) Residence by persons with intellectual disabilities or other developmental disabilities in 10 homes or in home-like settings that are in proximity to community resources, together with regular 11 contact with persons without disabilities in their community.

"(10)(a) 'Intellectual disability' means [significantly subaverage general intellectual functioning, defined as intelligence quotients under 70] an intelligence quotient of 70 or below as measured by a qualified professional and existing concurrently with significant impairment in adaptive behavior, that is manifested before the individual is 18 years of age.

16 "(b) An individual with intelligence quotients of [70] 71 through 75 may be considered to have 17 an intellectual disability if there is also significant impairment in adaptive behavior, as diagnosed 18 and measured by a qualified professional.

19 "(c) The impairment in adaptive behavior must be directly related to the intellectual disability.

20 "[(d) Intellectual disability is synonymous with mental retardation.]

21 "[(11) 'Intellectual functioning' means functioning as assessed by one or more of the individually 22 administered general intelligence tests developed for the purpose.]

23 "[(12)] (11) 'Minor' means an unmarried person under 18 years of age.

24 "[(13)] (12) 'Naturopathic physician' has the meaning given the term in ORS 685.010.

25 "[(14)] (13) 'Physician' means a person licensed by the Oregon Medical Board to practice medi-26 cine and surgery.

"[(15)] (14) 'Productivity' means regular engagement in income-producing work, [preferable] **preferably** competitive employment with supports and accommodations to the extent necessary, by a person with an intellectual disability or another developmental disability which is measured through improvements in income level, employment status or job advancement or engagement by a person with an intellectual disability or another developmental disability in work contributing to a household or community.

33 "[(16)] (15) 'Service coordination' means person-centered planning, case management, procuring, 34 coordinating and monitoring of services under an individualized support plan to establish desired 35 outcomes, determine needs and identify resources for a person with developmental disabilities and 36 advocating for the person.

37 "[(17) 'Significantly subaverage' means a score on a test of intellectual functioning that is two or 38 more standard deviations below the mean for the test.]

39 "[(18)] (16) 'Training' means:

40 "(a) The systematic, planned maintenance, development or enhancement of self-care, social or 41 independent living skills; or

42 "(b) The planned sequence of systematic interactions, activities, structured learning situations 43 or education designed to meet each person's specified needs in the areas of physical, emotional, in-44 tellectual and social growth.

45 "[(19)] (17) 'Treatment' means the provision of specific physical, mental, social interventions and

1 therapies that halt, control or reverse processes that cause, aggravate or complicate malfunctions 2 or dysfunctions. 3 **"AUTHORITY OF DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES** 4 TO IMPOSE CIVIL PENALTIES 5 6 "SECTION 8. (1) The Department of Human Services shall adopt by rule civil penalties 7 to be imposed, in accordance with ORS 183.745, on any provider contracting with the de-8 partment to provide intellectual or developmental disability services for a violation of a 9 statutory requirement or a rule adopted by the department applicable to the provision of 10 services described in ORS 409.010 (2). 11 "(2) This section may not be construed to supersede ORS 418.992 or 441.710 or any other 12statute that prescribes criteria for or limitations on the imposition of a civil penalty. 13"(3) Moneys collected by the department pursuant to rules adopted under this section 14 15shall be transferred to the State Treasury for deposit to the Department of Human Services Account established under ORS 409.060 and may be used by the division of the department 16 that provides developmental disabilities services for system improvements and the imple-1718 mentation of policies. 19 **"DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES** 20 DONATED FUND ACCOUNT 2122"SECTION 9. ORS 409.365 is amended to read: 23 "409.365. (1) The Department of Human Services [Volunteer Program] Donated Fund Account is 24 25established separate and distinct from the General Fund. Interest earned, if any, shall inure to the 26 benefit of the account. The moneys in the account are appropriated continuously to the Department 27of Human Services. "(2) The Department of Human Services [Volunteer Program] shall keep a record of all moneys 28 29 credited to and deposited in the Department of Human Services [Volunteer Program] Donated Fund Account. The record shall indicate the source from which the moneys are derived and the activity 30 or program against which each withdrawal is charged. 31"(3) All private donations or contributions made for the use or benefit of the Department of 3233 Human Services [Volunteer Program] shall be deposited in the Department of Human Services [Volunteer Program] Donated Fund Account. All funds deposited in that account shall be used [for direct 34program expenditures for the Department of Human Services Volunteer Program and shall not be used 35 for direct or indirect administrative expenditures] to support activities that align with the mission 36 of the Department of Human Services.". 37
