80th OREGON LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY--2019 Regular Session

A-Engrossed Senate Bill 20

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Consolidates eligibility for services to children and adults with developmental disabilities. Modifies types of developmental disability services that may be offered, [and] eligibility for services and entities that may deliver services. Establishes new terminology.

5	SECTION 1. ORS 427.101 is amended to read:
6	427.101. As used in this section and ORS 427.115, 427.121, 427.154 [and 427.160], 430.662 and
7	430.664:
8	[(1) "Adult" means an individual who is 18 years of age or older.]
9	(1) "Community living setting" means:
10	(a) A residential setting;
11	(b) An individual's home or the home of the individual's family; or
12	(c) Other nonresidential setting.
13	[(2) "Community living and inclusion supports"]
14	(2) "Developmental disability services" means [services that may or may not be work-related
15	and includes] the following services as provided for individuals with intellectual or develop-
16	mental disabilities:
17	(a) Services designed to develop or maintain the individual's skills in the following areas:
18	[(a)] (A) Eating, bathing, dressing, personal hygiene, mobility and other personal needs;
19	[(b)] (B) Self-awareness and self-control, social responsiveness, social amenities, interpersonal

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(b) Case management; 1 2 (c) Services described in ORS 430.215; (d) Employment services: 3 (e) Environmental accessibility adaptations; 4 (f) Specialized supports; and 5 (g) Specialized medical equipment and supplies. 6 7 [(3) "Comprehensive services" means a package of services, other than support services for adults, that is provided by or under the direction of a community developmental disabilities program and that 8 9 includes at least one of the following living arrangements licensed or regulated by the Department of Human Services:] 10 [(a) Twenty-four-hour residential care, including but not limited to a group home, a foster home or 11 12 a supported living program.] 13 [(b) Assistance provided to maintain an individual in the individual's own home or the home of the individual's family and that costs more than an amount specified by the department by rule.] 14 15 [(4)] (3) "Employment services" means services provided to develop or maintain the skills necessary for an individual to obtain and retain employment, including job assessment, job exploration, 16 job development, job training, job coaching, work skills, and ongoing supports. 17 18 [(5)] (4) "Environmental accessibility adaptations" means physical modifications to an 19 individual's home that are necessary to ensure the health, welfare and safety of the individual in the 20 home, or that enable the individual to function with greater independence in the home. [(6)] (5) "Individualized [written] service plan" means a plan described in ORS 427.107 (2)(i), (j) 2122and (k) that identifies the resources, services and purchases necessary for an individual with a de-23velopmental disability to achieve identified personal goals and maximize self-determination. [(7)] (6) "Person-centered planning" means an informal or formal process for gathering and or-94 ganizing information that helps an individual to: 25(a) Enhance self-determination by choosing personal goals and lifestyle preferences; 2627(b) Design strategies and networks of support to achieve personal goals and a preferred lifestyle using individual strengths, relationships and resources; and 28(c) Identify, use and strengthen naturally occurring opportunities for support in the home and 2930 in the community. 31 (7) "Residential setting" means one of the following community living settings licensed or regulated by the Department of Human Services: 32(a) Residential facilities licensed under ORS 443.400 to 443.455; 33 34 (b) Licensed adult foster homes, as defined in ORS 443.705; (c) Developmental disability child foster homes certified under ORS 443.835; 35(d) Group homes; and 36 37 (e) Supported living programs. (8) "Self-determination" means empowering individuals to: 38 (a) Make their own choices and decisions; 39 [(a)] (b) Select and plan, together with freely chosen family members and friends, the [support 40 services for adults] developmental disability services that are necessary [instead of purchasing a 41 predefined program or package of services] for an individual to live, work and recreate in the 42 setting that the individual chooses and in the community; 43 [(b)] (c) Control [the expenditure of available financial assistance in order to purchase support 44 services for adults], or have input regarding, the manner in which resources are used to obtain 45

needed services and supports, with the help of a social support network if needed; 1 2 [(c)] (d) Live an autonomous life in the community, rich in community affiliations, through formal or informal arrangements of resources and personnel and contribute to their community 3 in the ways they choose; [and] 4 $\mathbf{5}$ [(d)] (e) Have a valued role in the community through competitive employment, organizational affiliations, personal development and general caring for others in the community, and to be ac-6 countable for spending public dollars in ways that are life-enhancing for the individual; and 7 8 (f) Speak or act on their own behalf or on behalf of others, including participating in 9 policy-making and legislative processes. (9) "Service provider" means any person who is paid a service rate by the department to provide 10 one or more of the services identified in the individualized [written] service plan of an [adult with 11 12 a] individual with an intellectual or developmental disability regardless of where the service is 13 provided. (10) "Service rate" means the amount of reimbursement paid to a service provider to care for 14 15 an [adult with a] individual with an intellectual or developmental disability. 16 (11)(a) "Specialized medical equipment and supplies" means: (A) Devices, aids, controls, supplies or appliances that enable individuals: 17 18 (i) To increase their ability to perform activities of daily living; or 19 (ii) To perceive, control or communicate with the environment in which they live; (B) Items necessary for life support, including ancillary supplies and equipment necessary to the 20proper functioning of these items; and 2122(C) Medical equipment not available in the medical assistance program. 23(b) "Specialized medical equipment and supplies" does not include items that have no direct medical or remedial benefit to the individual. 24 25(12) "Specialized supports" means treatment, training, consultation or other unique services that are not available through the medical assistance program but are necessary to achieve the goals 2627identified in the individualized [written] service plan, or other [support services for adults] develop**mental disability services** prescribed by the department by rule. 28 (13) "Support service brokerage" means an entity that contracts with the department to provide 2930 or to arrange for [support services for adults] developmental disability services. 31 [(14) "Support services for adults" means the services for adults with developmental disabilities provided by a support service brokerage under ORS 427.154 and 427.160.] 32SECTION 2. ORS 427.115 is amended to read: 33 34 427.115. (1) The Department of Human Services or its designee shall assess the support needs 35for each [adult with a developmental disability who is receiving comprehensive services that include 24-hour residential care] individual with an intellectual or developmental disability who is re-36 37 ceiving developmental disability services in a residential setting and shall determine a service 38 rate that is sufficient to meet the support needs of the [adult] individual. If an assessment of support needs results in a change to the service rate being paid to the service provider, the department or 39 the department's designee shall provide to the [adult receiving comprehensive services and the adult's 40 service provider and, if appropriate, to the adult's service coordinator,] individual and the 41 individual's service provider and case manager and, if appropriate, to the individual's guard-42 ian, primary caregiver or family members, a detailed accounting of the service rate paid to the 43 service provider and the factors and weighting of factors used to determine the service rate. 44

45 (2) The department or the department's designee shall assess the support needs and determine

1 the service rate, as described in subsection (1) of this section, no later than 90 days after the [adult

5 a new assessment of support needs and a redetermination of the service rate.

6 (3) The department shall adopt by rule the procedures and criteria for requesting and conducting 7 an assessment of support needs and a determination of a service rate under this section, using an 8 advisory committee appointed in accordance with ORS 183.333. The rules shall include a procedure 9 for contesting the denial of a request for assessment of support needs and redetermination of a 10 service rate or the failure of the department or the department's designee to respond to a request 11 for assessment and redetermination within a reasonable period of time, as prescribed by the de-12 partment by rule.

(1) [Support services for adults are intended to meet the needs of adults with developmental 4 disabilities and to prevent or delay their need for comprehensive services.] Developmental disability 5 services are intended to meet the needs of individuals with intellectual or developmental 6 disabilities. The Department of Human Services shall establish by rule the application and eligibil-7 ity determination processes for [support services for adults] developmental disability services. 8 9 (2) [Support services for adults] Developmental disability services shall be provided [through a support service brokerage and pursuant to an individualized [written] service plan that is developed 10 and reassessed at least annually using a person-centered planning process. 11 12(3) The department shall ensure that each individual receiving [support services for adults] de-13 velopmental disability services and the individual's guardian or legal representative has an active role in choosing the services, activities and purchases that will best meet the individual's 14 15 needs and preferences and to express those choices verbally, using sign language or by other ap-16 propriate methods of communication. [(6)] (5) The department shall ensure that each individual and the individual's guardian or 28legal representative has the opportunity to confirm satisfaction with the [support services for 2930 adults] developmental disability services that the individual receives and to make changes in the 31 services as necessary. 32[(7)] (6) The department shall ensure that all [adults with developmental disabilities receiving comprehensive services] individuals receiving developmental disability services have an equal 33 34 opportunity for job placements. A provider of developmental disability services that offers job 35placements may not give preference to an [adult with disabilities] individual who is a resident of a facility owned or operated by the provider when determining eligibility for a job placement. (D) An adult foster home as defined in ORS 443.705. 1 2 (b) "Person" means an individual who has $[\alpha]$ an intellectual or developmental disability as 3 defined in ORS 427.005 and receives services from a program or facility. (f) Visit with family members, friends, advocates and legal and medical professionals. 19 (g) Participate regularly in the community and use community resources. 20(h) Not be required to perform labor, except personal housekeeping duties, without reasonable 21 22and lawful compensation. 23(i) Seek a meaningful life by choosing from available services and enjoying the benefits of com-24 munity involvement and community integration in a manner that is least restrictive to the person's liberty considering the person's preferences and age. 25(j) An individualized [written] service plan, services based upon that plan and periodic review 2627and reassessment of service needs. (k) Ongoing participation in the planning of services, including the right to participate in the 28development and periodic revision of the plan for services, the right to be provided with an expla-2930 nation of all service considerations in a manner that ensures meaningful individual participation and 31 the right to invite others of the person's choosing to participate in the plan for services. (o) Assert grievances with respect to infringement of the rights described in this section, in-39 cluding the right to have such grievances considered in a fair, timely and impartial grievance pro-40 cedure without any form of retaliation or punishment. 41 (p) Manage the person's own money and financial affairs unless that right has been taken away 42 by court order or other legal procedure. 43 (q) Keep and use personal property and have a reasonable amount of personal storage space. 44 (3) The rights described in this section are in addition to, and do not limit, all other statutory 45

and constitutional rights that are afforded all citizens including, but not limited to, the right to ex-1 2 ercise religious freedom, vote, marry, have or not have children, own and dispose of property, enter into contracts and execute documents. 3 (4) A person who is receiving developmental disability services has the right under ORS 430.212 4 to be informed and to have the person's guardian and any representative designated by the person 5 be informed that a family member has contacted the department to determine the location of the 6 person, and to be informed of the name and contact information, if known, of the family member. 7 (5) The rights described in this section may be asserted and exercised by the person, the 8 9 person's guardian and any representative designated by the person. 10 (6) Nothing in this section may be construed to alter any legal rights and responsibilities between parent and child. 11 12(7) The department shall adopt rules concerning the rights described in this section that are consistent with the directives set forth in ORS 427.007. 13 SECTION 6. (1) The Department of Human Services, in carrying out the legislative policy declared in ORS 427.007 and 430.610, subject to the availability of funds, shall: 16 (a) Use case management entities, including community developmental disabilities pro-1718 grams and support service brokerages, to provide case management services, using appropriate planning processes and implementation procedures, to ensure that: 19 (A) Persons with intellectual or developmental disabilities have the supports necessary 20to reside in the setting that they choose; and 2122(B) All persons with intellectual or developmental disabilities who are eligible for devel-23opmental disability services have access to the services. [(g)] (j) Make all necessary and proper rules to regulate the establishment and operation of [community developmental disabilities programs] developmental disability services.

(2) The enumeration of duties and functions in subsection (1) of this section may not be deemed
exclusive or construed as a limitation on the powers and authority vested in the department by
other provisions of law.

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SECTION 7. ORS 430.664 is amended to read:

430.664. [(1) In addition to any other requirements that may be established by rule by the Department of Human Services, each community developmental disabilities program may contract with the department to provide or arrange for the provision of the following basic services to persons with developmental disabilities:]

31 [(a) Eligibility determination for developmental disability services.]

32 [(b) Access to developmental disability services in homes, work sites or other locations that promote 33 independence, productivity and integration into the community.]

34 [(c) Case management services.]

35 [(d) Abuse investigation and protective services.]

36 [(e) Planning and coordination of activities with other agencies or organizations to ensure the ef-37 fective and efficient service delivery and use of resources.]

38 [(f) Establishing and implementing a process to respond to complaints and grievances.]

39 [(g) Other alternative services as prescribed by the department by rule.]

40 [(2)] (1) Each community developmental disabilities program and support service brokerage 41 shall have:

42 (a) A written management plan that governs the program's or brokerage's operating structure,

43 goals and activities; and

44 (b) A developmental disability advisory committee.

45 [(3) Each community developmental disabilities program shall have a developmental disability ad-

1 visory committee.]

2 [(4) Subject to the review and approval of the department, a community developmental disabilities 3 program may initiate additional services after the services described in this section are provided.]

4 (2) A person with an intellectual or developmental disability who is served by a support

5 service brokerage, and the person's family members, shall have an opportunity for a formal,

6 significant, continuing role in advising the support service brokerage regarding the design,

- 7 implementation and quality assurance of the support service brokerage.
