Senate Bill 327

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires trial judge to inform jury of power to acquit even if guilt of defendant is proven beyond reasonable doubt.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to jury instructions.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) During a criminal jury trial in which a defendant is charged with a felony, 5 before the jury begins deliberations, the court shall instruct the jury as follows: "As jurors, 6 if you feel that a conviction would not be a fair or just result in this case, it is within your 7 power to find the defendant not guilty even if you find that the state has proven the 8 defendant's guilt beyond a reasonable doubt."

9 (2) A court's failure to give the instruction described in subsection (1) of this section 10 constitutes a mistrial and is reversible error upon appeal.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2019 Act applies to trials for crimes committed on or after
the effective date of this 2019 Act.
