

SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 378

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “examinations” delete the rest of the line and insert
2 a period.

3 Delete lines 4 through 27 and delete page 2 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission, in collaboration with Disa-**
5 **bility Rights Oregon, the Oregon Health Authority and the Judicial Department, shall con-**
6 **duct a study identifying barriers to the timely:**

7 **“(a) Completion of accurate and reliable inpatient, outpatient and privately obtained fit-**
8 **ness to proceed evaluations under ORS 161.365 or 161.370; and**

9 **“(b) Admission of defendants for inpatient fitness to proceed evaluations following an**
10 **order of commitment under ORS 161.365 or 161.370.**

11 **“(2) The commission shall present the results of the study, along with any recommended**
12 **legislative changes, in a report to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related**
13 **to the judiciary in the manner provided under ORS 192.245 on or before September 15, 2021.**
14 **The report must include results specific to each county and must be made accessible to the**
15 **public.**

16 **“(3) All agencies of state government are directed to assist the commission in the per-**
17 **formance of the study and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to**
18 **furnish information and advice that the commission considers necessary to perform the**
19 **study.**

20 **“SECTION 2. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-**
21 **priated to the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019,**
22 **out of the General Fund, the amount of \$50,000, to be provided to Disability Rights Oregon**
23 **for the purposes of carrying out the provisions of section 1 of this 2019 Act.**

24 **“SECTION 3. Section 1 of this 2019 Act is repealed on January 2, 2022.”.**
