Senate Bill 546

Sponsored by Senator RILEY (at the request of Citizens Commission on Human Rights International) (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates crime of unlawful administration of electroconvulsive therapy. Punishes by maximum of five years' imprisonment, \$125,000 fine, or both. Creates civil cause of action when person under 18 years of age receives electroconvulsive therapy.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) Electroconvulsive therapy may not be administered to a person under 18 6 years of age.

7 (2) A person commits the crime of unlawful administration of electroconvulsive therapy

- 8 if the person intentionally causes a person under 18 years of age to be administered
 9 electroconvulsive therapy.
- 10 (3) Unlawful administration of electroconvulsive therapy is a Class C felony.
- (4) As used in this section, "electroconvulsive therapy" means a procedure during which
 an electric current is passed through the brain in order to trigger a seizure.
- 13 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) Notwithstanding the existence or result of any criminal prosecution, a 14 person under 18 years of age who receives electroconvulsive therapy in violation of section 15 1 of this 2019 Act, or the person's parent or guardian, shall have a civil action for damages 16 against:
- 17 (a) Any person whose actions are unlawful under section 1 of this 2019 Act; and
- (b) The medical facility in which the person described in paragraph (a) of this subsection
 committed the unlawful actions.
- 20 (2) Upon prevailing in such action, the plaintiff may recover:
- 21 (a) Special and general damages, including damages for emotional distress; and
- 22 (b) Punitive damages.
- (3) The court may award reasonable attorney fees to the prevailing plaintiff in an action
 under this section.
- (4) A civil action under this section does not affect a right or remedy available under any
 other law of this state.
- 27 (5) As used in this section:
- (a) "Electroconvulsive therapy" has the meaning given that term in section 1 of this 2019
 Act.
- 30 (b) "Medical facility" has the meaning given that term in ORS 164.365.
