

# A-Engrossed Senate Bill 5510

Ordered by the Senate June 11  
Including Senate Amendments dated June 11

Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with pre-session filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President (at the request of Oregon Department of Administrative Services)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to State Department of Fish and Wildlife for certain biennial expenses.

Limits certain biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds from Pacific Coastal Salmon Recovery Fund, but excluding lottery funds and other federal funds, collected or received by department.

Limits biennial expenditures by department from lottery moneys for certain purposes.

Limits biennial expenditures by department from federal funds for certain purposes.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2019.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to the financial administration of the State Department of Fish and Wildlife; and declaring an emergency.

**Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

**SECTION 1. There are appropriated to the State Department of Fish and Wildlife, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, out of the General Fund, the following amounts, for the following purposes:**

- (1) **Fish Division** ..... \$ **20,713,215**
- (2) **Wildlife Division**..... \$ **4,856,677**
- (3) **Administrative Services**  
**Division** ..... \$ **4,861,971**
- (4) **Debt service** ..... \$ **1,964,790**
- (5) **Capital improvement**..... \$ **155,668**
- (6) **State Police enforcement**..... \$ **2,389,141**

**SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and including federal funds from the Pacific Coastal Salmon Recovery Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in this section, collected or received by the State Department of Fish and Wildlife, for the following purposes:**

- (1) **Fish Division** ..... \$ **78,011,355**
- (2) **Wildlife Division**..... \$ **40,569,695**
- (3) **Administrative Services**

7 **SECTION 3.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts  
8 are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment  
9 of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Parks and Natural Resources Fund to  
10 the State Department of Fish and Wildlife, for activities and projects to implement Article  
11 XV, section 4 (8), of the Oregon Constitution, for the following purposes:

13	(2) Wildlife Division.....	\$ 1,378,209

14 **SECTION 4.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts  
15 are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, as the maximum limits for payment  
16 of expenses from federal funds other than those described in section 2 of this 2019 Act col-  
17 lected or received by the State Department of Fish and Wildlife, for the following purposes:

23 **SECTION 5.** This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public  
24 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect  
25 July 1, 2019.

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
