## Senate Bill 575

Sponsored by Senator KNOPP (at the request of Oregon Optometric Physicians Association) (Presession filed.)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires vision examination as part of evaluation before initially receiving special education.

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT
2	Relating to evaluations for special education; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 343.146.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. ORS 343.146 is amended to read:
5	343.146. (1) To receive special education, children with disabilities shall be determined eligible
6	for special education services under a school district program approved under ORS 343.045 and as
7	provided under ORS 343.221.
8	(2) Before initially providing special education, the school district shall ensure that a full and
9	individual evaluation is conducted to determine the child's eligibility for special education and the
10	child's special educational needs. An evaluation conducted under this subsection must include
11	a vision examination.
12	(3) Eligibility for special education shall be determined pursuant to rules adopted by the State
13	Board of Education.
14	(4) Each school district shall conduct a reevaluation of each child with a disability in accord-
15	ance with rules adopted by the State Board of Education.
16	(5) If a medical or vision examination or health assessment is required as part of an initial
17	evaluation or reevaluation, the evaluation shall be given:
18	(a) In the case of a medical examination, by a physician licensed to practice by a state board
19	of medical examiners or a state medical board or by a naturopathic physician licensed under ORS
20	chapter 685;
21	(b) In the case of a health assessment, by a nurse licensed by a state board of nursing and
22	specially certified as a nurse practitioner or by a licensed physician assistant; and
23	(c) In the case of a vision examination, by an ophthalmologist or optometrist licensed by a state
24	board.
25	SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 343.146 by section 1 of this 2019 Act apply to eval-
26	uations conducted on or after the effective date of this 2019 Act.
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
