Senate Bill 717

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND REVENUE

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Establishes refundable credit against personal income taxes for contributions to higher education savings network account.

Applies to tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2020, and before January 1, 2026. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4

 $\mathbf{5}$ SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2019 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 315.

6 SECTION 2. (1) A credit against taxes otherwise imposed under ORS chapter 316 is al-

7 lowed for amounts contributed during the tax year to a savings network account for higher 8 education established under ORS 178.300 to 178.355. The amount of the credit allowed under

9 this section must equal the amount contributed, but may not exceed \$_

10 (2) A taxpayer is allowed a credit under this section only if the taxpayer has an adjusted 11 gross income that does not exceed \$100,000 on a joint return, or \$50,000 on any other type 12of return.

(3) A taxpayer may claim both the credit allowed under this section and the subtraction 13 14 allowed in ORS 316.699 (1)(a) for the same tax year.

(4) If the amount allowable as a credit under this section, when added to the sum of the 15amounts allowable as payment of tax under ORS 316.187 (withholding), ORS 316.583 (esti-16 17 mated tax), other tax prepayment amounts and other refundable credit amounts, exceeds the 18 taxes imposed by ORS chapters 314 and 316 for the tax year (reduced by any nonrefundable credits allowable for purposes of ORS chapter 316 for the tax year), the amount of the excess 19 20 must be refunded to the taxpayer as provided in ORS 316.502.

21(5) The credit must be claimed on a form prescribed by the Department of Revenue that 22contains the information required by the department.

23 (6) In the case of a credit allowed under this section:

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(a) A nonresident is allowed the credit in the proportion provided in ORS 316.117.

25 (b) If a change in the status of the taxpayer from resident to nonresident or from nonresident to resident occurs, the credit must be determined in a manner consistent with ORS 2627 316.117.

28(c) If a change in the taxable year of the taxpayer occurs as described in ORS 314.085, 29 or if the department terminates the taxpayer's taxable year under ORS 314.440, the credit 30 must be prorated or computed in a manner consistent with ORS 314.085.
