

# Senate Bill 794

Sponsored by Senator GELSER, Representatives EVANS, NEARMAN; Senators DEMBROW, GIROD, GOLDEN, TAYLOR, WAGNER, Representatives ALONSO LEON, BOSCHART DAVIS, BYNUM, HERNANDEZ, KENY-GUYER, NERON, PILUSO, SALINAS, SCHOUTEN, SOLLMAN

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission to design question allowing each student to identify whether student is parent that will be placed on all forms used to collect demographic information by public post-secondary institutions of education.

Requires each public post-secondary institution of education to make data available to commission.

Requires commission to establish format and time frame for collection and reporting of demographic data, to evaluate public post-secondary institution of education compliance with collecting and providing data and to report to each regular session of Legislative Assembly on status of collecting and providing data.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to student demographic data at post-secondary institutions of education.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) The Higher Education Coordinating Commission, in consultation with**  
5 **public post-secondary institutions of education, shall by rule design a question that will:**

6 (a) Allow each student to identify whether the student is a parent; and

7 (b) Be placed on all forms that are used by public post-secondary institutions of education  
8 in this state to collect demographic data from students.

9 (2) Each public post-secondary institution of education in this state shall make the data  
10 collected under subsection (1) of this section available to the commission in the format de-  
11 termined by the commission under subsection (3) of this section.

12 (3) The commission shall:

13 (a) By rule establish a common format and time frame for the collection and reporting  
14 of the data collected under subsection (1) of this section. The format must require that the  
15 data collected under subsection (1) of this section be included with other demographic data  
16 of the students, so that the commission can identify the full demographic data, including  
17 ethnicity and income, of each student who identifies as a parent.

18 (b) Evaluate the degree to which public post-secondary institutions of education in this  
19 state are complying with the requirements set forth in subsections (1) and (2) of this section.

20 (c) During each regular session of the Legislative Assembly, submit a report in the  
21 manner provided by ORS 192.245 to the committees related to higher education that:

22 (A) Sets forth the progress public post-secondary institutions of education in this state  
23 have made toward implementing the requirements set forth in subsections (1) and (2) of this  
24 section; and

25 (B) Summarizes the data collected by the commission under this section.

26 **SECTION 2. (1) The requirements set forth in section 1 of this 2019 Act first apply to the**

1 2020-2021 academic year.

2 (2) The Higher Education Coordinating Commission and public post-secondary insti-  
3 tutions of education in this state may take any action before the 2020-2021 academic year  
4 that is necessary to enable the commission and institutions to exercise, during and after the  
5 2020-2021 academic year, all of the duties, functions and powers conferred on the commission  
6 and institutions by section 1 of this 2019 Act.

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
