## Senate Bill 822

Sponsored by Senator BEYER, Representative WILDE (at the request of Connor Gabor)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Directs State Board of Education to adopt rules requiring public high schools to provide condoms to students free of charge.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to condoms; and prescribing an effective date.

**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules requiring public high 5 schools in this state to make condoms accessible to students free of charge in a manner that 6 does not require a student to request the condoms from another person.

7 (2) The rules adopted under this section must:

8 (a) Require that condoms provided under this section meet any standards adopted by the
9 Oregon Health Authority under ORS 435.100;

(b) Require a public high school to place condoms in the restrooms of the public high
 school;

12 (c) Allow the administration of a public high school to place condoms in locations in ad-13 dition to the restrooms of the public high school that the administration determines appro-

14 priate to increase students' access to condoms;

(d) Require a public high school to allow a third-party for-profit or nonprofit entity to
 provide condoms free of charge in the public high school; and

(e) Direct the administration of a public high school to take measures to protect the
 privacy of a student who obtains condoms from the public high school.

19 (3)(a) The board may adopt other rules necessary to carry out this section.

20 (b) The board may consult with the authority in adopting rules under this section.

21 SECTION 2. (1) Section 1 of this 2019 Act becomes operative on January 1, 2020.

(2) The State Board of Education may take any action before the operative date specified
in subsection (1) of this section that is necessary to enable the board to exercise, on and
after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section, all of the duties, functions
and powers conferred on the board by section 1 of this 2019 Act.

26 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2019 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2019 27 regular session of the Eightieth Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.
