1	Delete line 9 of the printed bill and insert:
2	"SECTION 2. (1) The Department of State Police shall conduct a study on:
3	"(a) The percentage of firearms reported stolen in this state that are successfully re-
4	covered; and
5	"(b) How firearm serial numbers are used by law enforcement agencies and the extent
6	to which firearm serial numbers are used to solve crimes in this state.
7	"(2) The department shall present the results of the study described in subsection (1) of
8	this section, along with any recommended legislative changes, in a report to the Legislative
9	Assembly in the manner provided under ORS 192.245 on or before September 15, 2020.
10	"SECTION 3. The Department of State Police shall report annually to the Legislative
11	Assembly, in the manner provided under ORS 192.245, on:
12	"(1) The number of firearm transfer criminal background checks that are delayed more
13	than 30 minutes;
14	"(2) The length of time of the delays;
15	"(3) The number of delays that result in a determination that the firearm purchaser or
16	recipient is disqualified; and
17	"(4) The reasons for the determination that the firearm purchaser or recipient is dis-
18	qualified.
19	"SECTION 4. (1) The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission shall conduct a study by re-
20	viewing criminal conviction data and determining:
21	"(a) The number of crimes each year committed in this state in which a firearm reported
22	stolen was involved; and
23	"(b) The number of firearm-related crimes each year committed in this state by persons
24	licensed to carry concealed handguns under ORS 166.291 and 166.292.
25	"(2) The commission shall present the results of the study described in subsection (1) of
26	this section, along with any recommended legislative changes, in a report to the Legislative
27	Assembly in the manner provided under ORS 192.245 on or before September 15, 2020.
28	"SECTION 5. The Oregon Health Authority shall conduct a comprehensive, comparative
29	study on firearm-related deaths in relation to all other major causes of death in this state,
30	and present the results of the study, along with any recommended legislative changes, in a
31	report to the Legislative Assembly in the manner provided under ORS 192.245 on or before
32	September 15, 2020.
33	"SECTION 6. (1) The Department of Consumer and Business Services shall conduct a
34	study on the availability of insurance coverage for firearm owners held strictly liable for the

1	actions of another person who obtained the firearm without authorization and used the
2	firearm to commit a crime.
3	"(2) The department shall present the results of the study described in subsection (1) of
4	this section, along with any recommended legislative changes, in a report to the Legislative
5	Assembly in the manner provided under ORS 192.245 on or before September 15, 2020.".
