"SECTION 1. Section 8, chapter 87, Oregon Laws 2018, is amended to
read:

"Sec. 8. (1) For the biennium ending June 30, 2019, at the request of the 9 Oregon Department of Administrative Services, after the department consults 10 with the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, the State Treasurer is 11 12 authorized to issue lottery bonds pursuant to ORS 286A.560 to 286A.585 in an amount that produces \$9 million in net proceeds and interest earnings for 13 the purposes described in subsection (2) of this section, plus an additional 14 amount estimated by the State Treasurer to be necessary to pay bond-related 15costs. 16

"(3) The Legislative Assembly finds that the use of lottery bond proceeds will create jobs, further economic development, finance public education or restore and protect parks, beaches, watersheds and native fish and wildlife, and is authorized based on the following findings:

"(a) Individuals increase their potential for self-sufficiency and use fewer
 public resources when they have access to health care.

"(b) Individuals who have mental illnesses increase their potential for self-sufficiency and use fewer public resources when they have access to mental health services.
