**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 5046**

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after the semicolon insert “creating new
2 provisions; amending section 2, chapter 592, Oregon Laws 2017; repealing
3 section 123, chapter 702, Oregon Laws 2017;”.

4 Delete lines 4 through 15 and insert:

5 **“SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**
6 **the limitation on expenditures established by section 3, chapter 555,**
7 **Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the max-**
8 **imum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds collected or**
9 **received by the Commission for the Blind, is increased by \$963,482 for**
10 **expending supplemental award from the United States Department of**
11 **Education and carryforward funds from the Vocational Rehabilitation**
12 **Grant.**

13 **“SECTION 2.** Section 2, chapter 592, Oregon Laws 2017, is amended to
14 read:

15 **“Sec. 2.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the fol-
16 lowing amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as
17 the maximum limits for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other
18 revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and including federal funds from
19 the United States Forest Service for fire protection and for research projects,
20 but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in this section,
21 collected or received by the State Forestry Department, for the following

15 **“SECTION 3. Section 123, chapter 702, Oregon Laws 2017, is re-**
16 **pealed.**

17 **“SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the**
18 **General Fund appropriation made to the State Forestry Department**
19 **by section 1 (2), chapter 592, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium end-**
20 **ing June 30, 2019, is increased by \$31,545,752 for the payment of emer-**
21 **gency firefighting costs associated with the 2018 forest fire season.**

22 **“SECTION 5. (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the**
23 **General Fund appropriation made to the Water Resources Department**
24 **by section 1 (1), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium end-**
25 **ing June 30, 2019, for administrative services, is decreased by \$319,930.**

26 **“(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund**
27 **appropriation made to the Water Resources Department by section 1**
28 **(2), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30,**
29 **2019, for field services, is decreased by \$266,000.**

30 **“(3) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund**

1 appropriation made to the Water Resources Department by section 1
2 (3), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30,
3 2019, for water rights and adjudications, is decreased by \$200,000.

4 “(4) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund
5 appropriation made to the Water Resources Department by section 1
6 (4), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30,
7 2019, for technical services, is increased by \$19,611.

8 “(5) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund
9 appropriation made to the Water Resources Department by section 1
10 (5), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30,
11 2019, for the director’s office, is increased by \$766,319.

12 “SECTION 6. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
13 the expenditure limitation established by section 120, chapter 702,
14 Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the max-
15 imum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other reve-
16 nues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds
17 and federal funds, collected or received by the Department of State
18 Lands, from the Portland Harbor Cleanup Fund established by section
19 11, chapter 748, Oregon Laws 2017, is decreased by \$6,235,000.

20 “SECTION 7. (1) The amount of \$12,000,000 is transferred from the
21 Common School Fund to the Portland Harbor Cleanup Fund estab-
22 lished by section 11, chapter 748, Oregon Laws 2017, to be used for the
23 purposes specified in that section, subject to subsection (2) of this
24 section.

25 “(2) The transferred amount must be separately accounted for and
26 may be used only for purposes permissible under Article VIII, section
27 5, of the Oregon Constitution.

28 “SECTION 7a. (1) The amount of \$12,000,000 is transferred from the
29 State Highway Fund to the Portland Harbor Cleanup Fund established
30 by section 11, chapter 748, Oregon Laws 2017, to be used for the pur-

1 poses specified in that section, subject to subsection (2) of this section.

2 “(2) The transferred amount must be separately accounted for and
3 may be used only for purposes permissible under Article IX, section
4 3a, of the Oregon Constitution.

5 **“SECTION 8.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
6 the limitation on expenditures established by section 1 (1), chapter 375,
7 Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the max-
8 imum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys, or other rev-
9 enues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds
10 and federal funds, collected or received by the Department of State
11 Lands, for Common School Fund programs, is increased by \$4,922,972
12 for expenses associated with the cleanup efforts at the Goble, Oregon,
13 site on the Columbia River.

14 **“SECTION 9.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
15 General Fund appropriation made to the Land Use Board of Appeals
16 by section 1, chapter 536, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending
17 June 30, 2019, is increased by \$62,368 for unanticipated personal ser-
18 vices costs.

19 **“SECTION 10.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
20 the limitation on expenditures established by section 2, chapter 373,
21 Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the max-
22 imum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other reve-
23 nues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds
24 and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Board of
25 Naturopathic Medicine, is increased by \$100,000 for the payment of
26 costs associated with a new licensing database.

27 **“SECTION 11.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
28 the limitation on expenditures established by section 4, chapter 373,
29 Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the max-
30 imum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other reve-

1 nues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds
2 and federal funds, collected or received by the Board of Medical Im-
3 aging, is increased by \$60,000 for the payment of costs associated with
4 a new licensing database.

5 **“SECTION 12.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
6 the limitation on expenditures established by section 6, chapter 373,
7 Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the max-
8 imum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other reve-
9 nues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds
10 and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon State Veterinary
11 Medical Examining Board, is increased by \$100,000 for the payment of
12 costs associated with a new licensing database.

13 **“SECTION 13. (1)** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expendi-
14 tures, the expenditure limitation established by section 2 (1), chapter
15 572, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the
16 maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other
17 revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds received
18 from charges, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not de-
19 scribed in section 2, chapter 572, Oregon Laws 2017, collected or re-
20 ceived by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, for the
21 Chief Operating Office, is increased by \$29,866.

22 **“(2)** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the ex-
23 penditure limitation established by section 2 (7), chapter 572, Oregon
24 Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum
25 limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues,
26 including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds received from
27 charges, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described
28 in section 2, chapter 572, Oregon Laws 2017, collected or received by
29 the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, for Enterprise
30 Goods and Services, is increased by \$253,258.

1 **“NOTE:** Section 14 was deleted by amendment. Subsequent sections were
2 not renumbered.

3 **“SECTION 15.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
4 the limitation on expenditures established by section 4 (1), chapter 544,
5 Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the max-
6 imum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds, other than
7 those described in section 2, chapter 544, Oregon Laws 2017, collected
8 or received by the State Department of Fish and Wildlife, for the Fish
9 Division, is decreased by \$1,700,000.

10 **“SECTION 16.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
11 the limitation on expenditures established by section 4 (2), chapter 544,
12 Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the max-
13 imum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds, other than
14 those described in section 2, chapter 544, Oregon Laws 2017, collected
15 or received by the State Department of Fish and Wildlife, for the
16 Wildlife Division, is increased by \$1,700,000.

17 **“SECTION 17.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
18 the limitation on expenditures established by section 6 (1), chapter 595,
19 Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the max-
20 imum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other reve-
21 nues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds,
22 federal funds and funds described in sections 9 and 10, chapter 595,
23 Oregon Laws 2017, collected or received by the Higher Education Co-
24 ordinating Commission, for operations, is increased by \$125,000 for ex-
25 pending the funds of a grant from the Lumina Foundation.

26 **“SECTION 18.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
27 the limitation on expenditures established by section 6 (1), chapter 595,
28 Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the max-
29 imum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other reve-
30 nues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds,

1 federal funds and funds described in sections 9 and 10, chapter 595,
2 Oregon Laws 2017, collected or received by the Higher Education Co-
3 ordinating Commission, for operations, is increased by \$40,700 for the
4 costs of administering the Volunteers program grant.

5 **“SECTION 19.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
6 the limitation on expenditures established by section 5 (1), chapter 590,
7 Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the max-
8 imum limit for payment of grants-in-aid, program costs and purchased
9 services from federal funds, other than those described in sections 4
10 and 10, chapter 590, Oregon Laws 2017, received by the Department of
11 Education, for early learning programs, is increased by \$1,010,625 for
12 a pilot project to provide child care for infants and toddlers.

13 **“SECTION 20.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
14 the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 582,
15 Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the max-
16 imum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other reve-
17 nues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds
18 and federal funds, collected or received by the Public Defense Services
19 Commission, for professional services, is decreased by \$90,000.

20 **“SECTION 21.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
21 the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (2), chapter 582,
22 Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the max-
23 imum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other reve-
24 nues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds
25 and federal funds, collected or received by the Public Defense Services
26 Commission, for the Contract and Business Services Division, is in-
27 creased by \$90,000.

28 **“SECTION 22.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
29 General Fund appropriation made to the Public Defense Services
30 Commission by section 1 (2), chapter 582, Oregon Laws 2017, for the

1 biennium ending June 30, 2019, for professional services, is increased
2 by \$4,493,458.

3 **“SECTION 23.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
4 General Fund appropriation made to the Department of Justice by
5 section 1 (6), chapter 576, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending
6 June 30, 2019, for the Division of Child Support, is decreased by
7 \$1,343,260 for the child support enforcement automated system project.

8 **“SECTION 24.** There is appropriated to the Department of Justice,
9 for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, out of the General Fund, the
10 amount of \$1,343,260, for system development costs for the child sup-
11 port enforcement automated system.

12 **“SECTION 25.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
13 General Fund appropriation made to the Department of Justice by
14 section 1 (5), chapter 576, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending
15 June 30, 2019, for the defense of criminal convictions, is increased by
16 \$700,000.

17 **“SECTION 26.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
18 General Fund appropriation made to the Department of Justice by
19 section 1, chapter 535, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June
20 30, 2019, for the payment of expenses of district attorneys, is increased
21 by \$350,000.

22 **“SECTION 27.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
23 General Fund appropriation made to the Department of Corrections
24 by section 1 (1), chapter 573, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium end-
25 ing June 30, 2019, for operations and health services, is increased by
26 \$30,381,426.

27 **“SECTION 28.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
28 General Fund appropriation made to the Department of Corrections
29 by section 1 (2), chapter 573, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium end-
30 ing June 30, 2019, for central administration and administrative ser-

1 vices, is increased by \$11,133,885.

2 **“SECTION 29.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
3 General Fund appropriation made to the Department of Corrections
4 by section 1 (3), chapter 573, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium end-
5 ing June 30, 2019, for offender management and rehabilitation, is de-
6 creased by \$2,000,000.

7 **“SECTION 30.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
8 General Fund appropriation made to the Department of Corrections
9 by section 1 (4), chapter 573, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium end-
10 ing June 30, 2019, for community corrections, is increased by \$1,504,245.

11 **“SECTION 31.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
12 General Fund appropriation made to the Department of Corrections
13 by section 1 (6), chapter 573, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium end-
14 ing June 30, 2019, for capital improvements, is decreased by \$1,276,717.

15 **“SECTION 32.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
16 the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 573,
17 Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the max-
18 imum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other reve-
19 nues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds
20 and federal funds, collected or received by the Department of Cor-
21 rections, for operations and health services, is increased by \$4,902,939.

22 **“SECTION 33.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
23 the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (2), chapter 573,
24 Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the max-
25 imum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other reve-
26 nues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds
27 and federal funds, collected or received by the Department of Cor-
28 rections, for central administration and administrative services, is
29 decreased by \$6,384,560.

30 **“SECTION 34.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,

1 the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (3), chapter 573,
2 Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the max-
3 imum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other reve-
4 nues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds
5 and federal funds, collected or received by the Department of Cor-
6 rections, for offender management and rehabilitation, is increased by
7 \$591,035.

8 **“SECTION 35.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
9 the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (4), chapter 573,
10 Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the max-
11 imum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other reve-
12 nues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds
13 and federal funds, collected or received by the Department of Cor-
14 rections, for community corrections, is increased by \$890,587.

15 **“SECTION 36.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
16 General Fund appropriation made to the Department of State Police
17 by section 1 (4), chapter 581, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium end-
18 ing June 30, 2019, for administrative services, agency support, criminal
19 justice information services and the office of the State Fire Marshal,
20 is increased by \$6,665,000.

21 **“SECTION 37.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
22 the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 581,
23 Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the max-
24 imum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other reve-
25 nues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds
26 and federal funds, collected or received by the Department of State
27 Police, for patrol services, criminal investigations and gaming
28 enforcement, is increased by \$4,100,000.

29 **“SECTION 38.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
30 the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (2), chapter 581,

1 Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Department of State Police, for fish and wildlife enforcement, is increased by \$2,900,000.

6 **“SECTION 39.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (4), chapter 581, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Department of State Police, for administrative services, agency support, criminal justice information services and the office of the State Fire Marshal, is decreased by \$7,000,000.

15 **“SECTION 40.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the Oregon Military Department by section 1 (1), chapter 566, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, for administration, is increased by \$50,100.

19 **“SECTION 41.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (4), chapter 566, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and reimbursements from federal service agreements, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in section 2, chapter 566, Oregon Laws 2017, collected or received by the Oregon Military Department, for community support, is increased by \$3,850,000.

28 **“SECTION 42.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 4, chapter 510, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum

1 imum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds collected or
2 received by the State Library, is increased by \$140,000.

3 **“SECTION 43.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
4 **General Fund** appropriation made to the Emergency Board by section
5 **1, chapter 702, Oregon Laws 2017,** for the biennium ending June 30,
6 **2019,** as modified by legislative or Emergency Board action, is de-
7 **creased by \$57,255,961.**

8 **“SECTION 44.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the au-
