**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 2638**

- 1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “430.241” insert “and 430.242”.
- 2 In line 18, delete “12” and insert “13” and delete “16” and insert “17”.
- 3 On page 2, line 10, delete “and”.
- 4 In line 11, delete the period and insert “;
- 5 “(I) Entities that provide housing to individuals who are in recovery; and
- 6 “(J) Social service providers.”.
- 7 In lines 24 through 27, restore the bracketed material and delete the
- 8 boldfaced material.
- 9 In line 28, after “(5)” insert “(a)”.
- 10 After line 29, insert:
- 11 “(b) If a member of the commission is absent for more than two consec-
- 12 utive scheduled meetings of the commission, the Director of the Alcohol and
- 13 Drug Policy Commission appointed under section 2, chapter 44, Oregon Laws
- 14 2018, may recommend to the Governor that the member be replaced.”.
- 15 After line 45, insert:
- 16 “**SECTION 2.** ORS 430.242, as amended by section 4, chapter 44, Oregon
- 17 Laws 2018, is amended to read:
- 18 “430.242. (1) For purposes of this section, ‘program’ means a state, [*or*]
