## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2222

1 On <u>page 1</u> of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 30 and delete <u>page</u> 2 <u>2</u> and insert:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The State Forestry Department shall annually report regarding the implementation and enforcement status of property
notifications and certifications required under ORS 477.015 to 477.061.
The report shall include, but need not be limited to:

"(a) General information concerning progress toward the completion and coordination of the forestland-urban interface fire protection system, and measures taken to ensure that the fire protection
system minimizes costs and risks and maximizes the effectiveness and
efficiency of fire protection;

12 "(b) Specific information for each community fire protection system 13 regarding land identification and classification, system review and as-14 sessment, efforts to promote and encourage property owners to mini-15 mize and mitigate fire risk, efforts to encourage involvement and 16 participation by government and private sectors and system features 17 to ensure the adequacy of public safety and the protection of property 18 development and natural resources; and

"(c) Information regarding actions by the department to develop,
 administer and enforce the fire protection system, including but not
 limited to any new rules or proposed rules developed for public safety

1 and public education.

"(2) The department shall make the report, including any recom mendations for further legislative action, to:

"(a) The regular session of the Legislative Assembly, in the manner
provided by ORS 192.245, no later than June 15 of each odd-numbered
year; and

"(b) An interim committee of the Legislative Assembly relating to
natural resources, in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, no later
than June 15 of each even-numbered year.

"SECTION 2. Notwithstanding section 1 (2) of this 2019 Act, the
 State Forestry Department may make the initial report under section
 1 of this 2019 Act to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly
 relating to natural resources no later than September 15, 2019.

"<u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate
 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
 declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect on its passage.".

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
