**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 2375**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the first semicolon delete the
2 rest of the line and line 3 and insert “amending ORS 147.401.”.

3 Delete lines 5 through 27 and delete pages 2 through 13 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1.** ORS 147.401 is amended to read:

5 “147.401. (1) The district attorney in each county shall organize a sexual
6 assault response team to consist of:

7 “(a) A representative of the district attorney’s office;

8 “(b) A representative of a prosecution-based victim assistance program or
9 unit;

10 “(c) A sexual assault forensic examiner;

11 “(d) At the discretion of the district attorney, a representative of the
12 county sheriff’s office or a representative of local law enforcement agencies
13 or both;

14 “(e) A representative of a nonprofit agency or program that receives
15 moneys administered by the Department of Human Services or the Depart-
16 ment of Justice and that offers safety planning, counseling, support or ad-
17 vocacy to victims of sexual assault; *[and]*

18 **“(f) A sexual assault nurse examiner or a representative of a hos-
19 pital; and**

20 “[*(f)*] **(g)** Other persons the district attorney considers necessary for the
21 operation of the team or as recommended by the team.

1 “(2) Each team must meet:

2 “(a) At least quarterly at a time appointed by the district attorney of the
3 county; and

4 “(b) Independently of the county’s multidisciplinary child abuse team.

5 “(3)(a) Each team shall develop and adopt protocols addressing the re-
6 sponse to adult and adolescent sexual assault victims in the county.

7 “(b) Protocols adopted pursuant to paragraph (a) of this subsection may
8 incorporate by reference, in part or in whole, protocols relating to child
9 sexual abuse developed pursuant to ORS 418.747.”.

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
