**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 958**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 24 and delete pages
2 2 through 4 and insert:

3 **“SECTION 1. Sections 2 to 4 of this 2019 Act are added to and made**
4 **a part of ORS chapter 348.**

5 **“SECTION 2. (1) As used in sections 2 to 4 of this 2019 Act:**

6 **“(a) ‘Eligible student’ means an individual who:**

7 **“(A) Is enrolled in sufficient credit hours to be considered at least**
8 **a half-time student in a baccalaureate or graduate degree program at**
9 **a public university;**

10 **“(B) Is making satisfactory academic progress, as defined by the**
11 **Higher Education Coordinating Commission by rule, at the public**
12 **university;**

13 **“(C) Is exempted from paying nonresident tuition under ORS**
14 **352.287;**

15 **“(D) Has completed and submitted to the commission the Free Ap-**
16 **plication for Federal Student Aid, or an equivalent Oregon application**
17 **established by the commission by rule; and**

18 **“(E) Is not incarcerated.**

19 **“(b) ‘Loan recipient’ means an eligible student who has received a**
20 **loan under the Dreamers Access Program.**

21 **“(c) ‘Public university’ means:**

1 **“(A) A public university listed in ORS 352.002; or**

2 **“(B) Oregon Health and Science University.**

3 **“(2) The Dreamers Access Program is established within the Higher**
4 **Education Coordinating Commission, to be administered pursuant to**
5 **rules adopted by the commission. The commission may enter into any**
6 **contracts necessary to implement sections 2 to 4 of this 2019 Act.**

7 **“(3) The commission shall determine:**

8 **“(a) Whether each individual who has completed and submitted to**
9 **the commission an application described in subsection (1)(a)(D) of this**
10 **section is an eligible student;**

11 **“(b) Whether each individual identified in paragraph (a) of this**
12 **subsection has a financial need for the academic year such that, in the**
13 **opinion of the commission, a loan is warranted, taking into consider-**
14 **ation the availability of an Oregon Opportunity Grant for the appli-**
15 **cant; and**

16 **“(c) Subject to subsection (6) of this section, the dollar amount of**
17 **the loan.**

18 **“(4) If the commission determines under subsection (3) of this sec-**
19 **tion that an applicant is an eligible student and that a loan is war-**
20 **ranted, the commission shall award a loan to the eligible student**
21 **under the program.**

22 **“(5) A loan recipient may apply for an additional loan under this**
23 **section each academic year. The commission shall by rule establish**
24 **academic standards and benchmarks that a loan recipient must meet**
25 **to qualify for additional loans.**

26 **“(6) A loan recipient may not receive Dreamers Access Program**
27 **loans that exceed:**

28 **“(a) For an undergraduate student, the lesser of:**

29 **“(A) An amount per academic year that is established by the com-**
30 **mission by rule to equal the maximum amount of Federal Stafford**

1 **Loans, or their successor, that a dependent undergraduate student**
2 **could receive; or**

3 **“(B) The financial need of the loan recipient for an academic year,**
4 **as determined in subsection (3)(b) of this section.**

5 **“(b) For a graduate student, the lesser of:**

6 **“(A) \$10,000 in any academic year; or**

7 **“(B) The financial need of the loan recipient for an academic year,**
8 **as determined in subsection (3)(b) of this section.**

9 **“(c) An aggregate total of \$50,000.**

10 **“(7) Each public university shall provide loan recipients with en-**
11 **trance and exit loan counseling that is comparable to the counseling**
12 **the public university is required to provide to recipients of federal**
13 **student loans.**

14 **“(8)(a) The commission shall establish the interest rate or rates for**
15 **loans awarded under this section in the manner described in section**
16 **3 of this 2019 Act.**

17 **“(b) The standard repayment term for a loan awarded under this**
18 **section is 10 years. Repayment by a loan recipient shall begin following**
19 **a six-month grace period that begins when a loan recipient graduates**
20 **or is no longer enrolled in sufficient credit hours to be considered at**
21 **least a half-time student in a baccalaureate or graduate degree pro-**
22 **gram at a public university.**

23 **“(c) Interest may not accrue on a loan awarded under this section**
24 **during:**

25 **“(A) Periods when the loan recipient is enrolled in sufficient credit**
26 **hours to be considered at least a half-time student in a baccalaureate**
27 **or graduate degree program at a public university; or**

28 **“(B) The six-month grace period described in paragraph (b) of this**
29 **subsection.**

30 **“(9) All moneys from repayment of loans awarded under this section**

1 shall be deposited in the Dreamers Access Program Fund established
2 in section 4 of this 2019 Act.

3 “(10) Eligibility for deferment or forbearance of a loan awarded
4 under this section shall be determined by the commission in a manner
5 that is consistent with the standards used to determine deferment or
6 forbearance of federal student loans.

7 “(11) If a loan recipient defaults on the repayment of a loan awarded
8 under this section, the commission may:

9 “(a) Have any amounts due be collected by the Collections Unit in
10 the Department of Revenue under ORS 293.250; and

11 “(b) Report the loan recipient’s default to a consumer reporting
12 agency as defined in ORS 646A.602.

13 **“SECTION 3. The Higher Education Coordinating Commission shall:**

14 **“(1) Adopt rules to administer the Dreamers Access Program es-**
15 **tablished in section 2 of this 2019 Act.**

16 **“(2) Develop a master promissory note to be used for loans awarded**
17 **under the program.**

18 **“(3) Subject to subsection (1) of this section, for each loan awarded**
19 **under the program, service the loan, collect all loan payments and**
20 **perform all due diligence required by the federal Fair Credit Reporting**
21 **Act (15 U.S.C. 1681 et seq.) and any other applicable laws.**

22 **“(4) Establish the interest rate to be used for loans awarded under**
23 **the program. In determining the interest rate to be used, the com-**
24 **mission must consider:**

25 **“(a) The risk that loan recipients will default on the repayment of**
26 **the loans; and**

27 **“(b) The effect the interest rate will have on the cost for loan re-**
28 **ipients to repay the loans.**

29 **“(5) Track and record the dollar amount of loans awarded to each**
30 **loan recipient under the program:**

- 1 “(a) For each academic year; and
2 “(b) As an aggregate total amount.

3 “SECTION 4. (1) The Dreamers Access Program Fund is established
4 in the State Treasury, separate and distinct from the General Fund.
5 Amounts in the Dreamers Access Program Fund may be invested as
6 provided in ORS 293.701 to 293.857. Interest earned by the Dreamers
7 Access Program Fund shall be credited to the fund. Moneys in the
8 fund are continuously appropriated to the Higher Education Coordinating
9 Commission for the purpose of awarding loans and administering
10 the Dreamers Access Program under sections 2 and 3 of this 2019
11 Act.

12 “(2) The fund shall consist of:

13 “(a) Moneys received as repayment of loans awarded under the
14 Dreamers Access Program;

15 “(b) Moneys appropriated or otherwise transferred to the fund by
16 the Legislative Assembly;

17 “(c) Moneys received from federal, state or local sources;

18 “(d) Amounts donated to the fund;

19 “(e) Investment earnings received on moneys in the fund; and

20 “(f) Other amounts deposited in the fund from any source, public
21 or private.

22 “SECTION 5. The Higher Education Coordinating Commission shall
23 file with the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related
24 to higher education, in the manner provided in ORS 192.245, a biennial
25 report that states:

26 “(1) The mean and median dollar amount of loans awarded during
27 the previous biennium under the Dreamers Access Program estab-
28 lished in section 2 of this 2019 Act.

29 “(2) The total number of students who received a loan under the
30 program during the previous biennium.

1 **“(3) The total amount of moneys within the Dreamers Access Pro-**
2 **gram Fund established in section 4 of this 2019 Act at the end of the**
3 **most recent academic year.**

4 **“(4) The total amount of moneys appropriated or otherwise provided**
5 **to the fund by the Legislative Assembly during the current biennium.**

6 **“(5) The commission’s annual administrative costs for administer-**
7 **ing the Dreamers Access Program established in section 2 of this 2019**
8 **Act.**

9 **“SECTION 6. Sections 2 and 3 of this 2019 Act first apply to loans**
10 **for the 2020-2021 academic year.**

11 **“SECTION 7. The Higher Education Coordinating Commission shall**
12 **submit the first biennial reports required under section 5 of this 2019**
13 **Act no later than December 1, 2022.**

14 **“SECTION 8. This 2019 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the**
15 **date on which the 2019 regular session of the Eightieth Legislative**
16 **Assembly adjourns sine die.”.**

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
