PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2883

1 On <u>page 1</u> of the printed bill, delete lines 5 through 28 and delete <u>page</u> 2 2 and insert:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Task Force on Recycling, Recovery and
 Composting of Food Service Materials is established.

5 "(2) The task force consists of nine members appointed by the 6 Governor as follows:

"(a) Two members shall be persons who actively participate in recycling polystyrene; and

9 "(b) Seven members shall be persons who are knowledgeable about
 10 recycling, recovery and composting.

11 "(3) The task force shall review and assess technologies available 12 in the recycling, recovery and composting of food service materials to 13 develop a policy to increase recycling, recovery and composting of food 14 service materials as an alternative to a prohibition on polystyrene 15 containers for prepared food.

"(4) The task force may make recommendations based on the re view and assessment under subsection (3) of this section.

"(5) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a
 quorum for the transaction of business.

"(6) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a
 majority of the members of the task force.

1 "(7) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as 2 chairperson.

"(8) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the Governor shall make
an appointment to become immediately effective.

5 "(9) The task force shall meet through 2020, at times and places 6 specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the mem-7 bers of the task force.

8 "(10) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation
9 of the task force.

"(11) No later than September 15, 2020, the task force shall submit
 a report in the manner provided in ORS 192.245, and may include rec ommendations for legislation, to the Department of Environmental
 Quality and an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related
 to the environment.

"(12) The Department of Environmental Quality shall provide staff
 support to the task force.

"(13) Members of the task force are not entitled to compensation
or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task
force.

"(14) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of the duties of the task force and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the task force consider necessary to perform their duties.

"SECTION 2. (1) No later than September 15, 2024, the Department
 of Environmental Quality shall submit a report in the manner pro vided in ORS 192.245 to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to the environment.

"(2) The report required by subsection (1) of this section shall:
"(a) Take into account the report by the Task Force on Recycling,

Recovery and Composting of Food Service Materials that is required
 by section 1 of this 2019 Act;

"(b) Identify progress the state is making to establish a meaningful
recycling, recovery and composting infrastructure for food service
packaging materials in this state, as an alternative to a prohibition
on polystyrene containers for prepared food; and

"(c) Include recommendations for any legislation that may be
needed to further the progress identified in paragraph (b) of this subsection.

"<u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) On or after the effective date of this 2019 Act, a city, county or other local government may not adopt or amend a charter provision, ordinance, resolution or other provision to prohibit or limit a food vendor's use of a polystyrene container in selling, offering for sale, serving or dispensing prepared food to a member of the public.

16 "(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1) of this section, a city, county 17 or other local government may enforce a charter provision, ordinance, 18 resolution or other provision that prohibits or limits a food vendor's 19 use of a polystyrene container in selling, offering for sale, serving or 20 dispensing prepared food to a member of the public, if the charter 21 provision, ordinance, resolution or other provision was in effect before 22 the effective date of this 2019 Act.

"SECTION 4. Section 1 of this 2019 Act is repealed on December 31,
24 2020.

"<u>SECTION 5.</u> Section 2 of this 2019 Act is repealed on January 2,
 2025.

27 "SECTION 6. Section 3 of this 2019 Act is repealed on January 2,
28 2026.
