PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 971

1 Delete lines 4 through 10 of the printed bill and insert:

2 **"SECTION 1. The Legislative Assembly finds and declares that:**

"(1) American Indian tribal languages have been spoken since time
immemorial and are still spoken.

5 "(2) Oregon's American Indian languages have been interrupted by 6 relocation of American Indian tribes to reservations, separation of 7 American Indian tribes, eradication of ancestral livelihoods, federal 8 boarding school policies, forced religious conversion and other 9 systemic federal policies to assimilate American Indian people into the 10 greater American population.

"(3) American Indian languages are also known as heritage lan guages and are in different stages of revitalization in tribal commu nities in Oregon.

"(4) Heritage languages are vital and the efforts at revitalization
 by American Indian tribes deserve recognition and support in addition
 to ORS 329.493 and 342.144.

"<u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) As used in this section and section 1 of this 2019
 Act, 'American Indian tribe' means an Indian tribe as that term is
 defined in ORS 97.740.

"(2) The Legislative Assembly declares that the American Indian
 languages of the nine tribes of Oregon, as follows, are official Oregon

1 heritage languages:

2 "(a) Burns Paiute Tribe: Paiute and Wadatika Yaduan.

"(b) The Confederated Tribes of Coos, Lower Umpqua and Siuslaw
Indians: Miluk, Hanis and Sha'yushtl'a.

5 "(c) The Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde Community of
6 Oregon: Chinook (Chinuk) Wawa.

7 "(d) The Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians: Athabaskan.

8 "(e) The Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation:
9 Umatilla, Walla Walla and Weyiiletpuu.

"(f) The Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs: Kiksht, Ichishkiin
 and Numu.

12 "(g) Coquille Indian Tribe: Miluk, Athabaskan and Chinuk Wawa.

13 "(h) Cow Creek Band of Umpqua Tribe of Indians: Takelma.

14 "(i) Klamath Tribes: Klamath.

"(3) Each American Indian tribe of Oregon may determine its needs 15for and plans to revitalize its heritage languages. The Department of 16 Education shall communicate at least once each quarter with each 17 American Indian tribe regarding the needs and plans of each American 18 Indian tribe and shall provide any needed assistance and support to the 19 American Indian tribe, including collaboration in the development of 20a curriculum with Oregon educators, the establishment of community 21forums and the creation of learning spaces for the American Indian 22tribe. 23

24 "<u>SECTION 3.</u> There is appropriated to the Department of Education, 25 for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, out of the General Fund, the 26 amount of \$900,000 for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of 27 section 2 of this 2019 Act.

"<u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate
 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
 declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect on its passage.".
