## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 3270

In line 2 of the printed bill, after "homes" insert a period and delete the rest of the line.

3 Delete lines 4 through 23 and insert:

"SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Human Services shall admin-4 ister a pilot program to allow certain adult foster homes that are li- $\mathbf{5}$ censed to care for older adults and persons with disabilities to provide 6 care to seven adults. Except for ORS 443.705 (1), requirements under 7 ORS 443.705 to 443.825 and rules adopted by the department pursuant 8 to ORS 443.705 to 443.825 apply to adult foster homes that participate 9 in the pilot program. The department shall adopt additional require-10 ments by rule for participating adult foster homes to: 11

"(a) Ensure that a resident's agreement to give up a single occu pancy room and share a room with another resident is voluntary;

14 "(b) Require that a resident who agrees to share a room under 15 paragraph (a) of this subsection signs a residency agreement attesting 16 that the resident's agreement to share a room with another resident 17 is voluntary; and

"(c) Require an adult foster home, before participating in the pilot program, to pass a physical inspection conducted by the department to determine if the home and the operation of the home can safely accommodate two additional residents. 1 "(2) In approving an adult foster home for the pilot program, the 2 department must take into account:

"(a) The adult foster home's compliance with regulatory requirements during the preceding two-year period.

5 "(b) The history of abuse complaints and the findings of investi-6 gators in response to complaints of abuse.

"(c) Input from the local regulatory authority about the adult foster
home's overall ability to take on an additional resident.

"(3)(a) The department shall provide to the Long Term Care Om-9 budsman a list of adult foster homes participating in the pilot pro-10 gram. The ombudsman shall take steps necessary to ensure that 11 residents in the participating adult foster homes are aware of the 12services provided by the ombudsman and are informed about the 13 availability of the Long Term Care Ombudsman and the Residential 14 Facilities Ombudsman to assist the residents with concerns that may 15arise during the course of the pilot program. 16

"(b) The department shall consult with the Long Term Care Om budsman regarding any concerns of the ombudsman that arose from
 a past investigation of a participating adult foster home.

"(4) The department shall track and compile data on the success of the pilot program and on the frequency of monitoring of the adult foster homes by the local regulatory authorities. The data must include, but is not limited to, monitoring increases or decreases in:

24 "(a) The number of complaints;

25 **"(b)** The number of violations of licensing requirements;

<sup>26</sup> "(c) The number of substantiated complaints of abuse; and

<sup>27</sup> "(d) Resident satisfaction, as measured by resident surveys.

"<u>SECTION 2.</u> No later than September 15, 2022, the Department of
 Human Services shall report to the interim committees of the Legis lative Assembly related to health, in the manner provided in ORS
