Since 1989, I have been a doctor as well as a farmer and rancher in the Klamath Basin. I am an avid outdoorsman and well and all of my activities have exposed me to the very real and detrimental aspects of climate change that is affecting our state and my region in particular

I am writing to you to express concern about the escalating risks and effects of a changing climate in my community.

I am certain that the impacts I witness, and experience are not isolated.
