<u>HB 4067</u>

- While AWEC supports conversations around the energy burdens on low-impact customers, and specifically does not oppose legislation that would allow for differential rates for low-income customers, we have concerns with the bill as drafted.
- The concern with HB 4067 is the inclusion of environmental mandates into the commission's decisions. This makes it very difficult for the Public Utility Commission (PUC) to identify an objective economic basis for decisions that take environmental justice into account, and to allocate costs associated with environmental justice activities to customers.
- AWEC feels that this is outside of the scope of what the PUC does and is capable of doing as an economic regulator.
