My name is Sarah Rohrs. I live in Salem, Oregon. I am writing to urge you to reject HB 4049 which would divert clean energy funds to assist the aging Covanta Marion Inc. waste incinerator.

Please reject this bill and any attempts to use clean energy subsidies to support burning trash at Oregon's only waste incinerator.

Coventa Marion has been burning waste since 1987. It is one of the state's top polluters, a significant single source of greenhouse gas emissions. As Oregon and the rest of the country faces climate change I urge you to not provide funding for clean energy to a facility that is contributing to global warming and our climate crisis.

Covanta sends a steady stream of pollutants into the air, including particulate matter, nitrogen oxides, sulfur oxides and toxic dioxins.Cleaner Air Oregon selected Covanta Marion for priority inspection out of numerous faciliteis in Oregon.
