To offer tax credits to Covanta for solid waste incineration is to literally step back in time, putting old technology at work for the benefit of a corporation over the quality of life for people in the community.

We are also aware that, under the guise of needing these tax credits, Covanta is working to increase their own bottom line at the expense of the people.
