

Dear Judiciary Committee:

HB 4005 is too intrusive. Families, and citizens in general, should have the freedom to decide how to handle risk in their own homes, whether it's sexual practices, the use of controlled substances such as alcohol or marijuana, or the storage of firearms or other potentially hazardous items such as cleaning chemicals, gasoline, paint, etc. Additionally, it appears to be a solution searching for a problem, since there are many, many other more frequent causes of injury in the public sphere that should be addressed before we start doing things like dictating risk management in private homes such as non-slip mats for bathtubs (also an in-home risk!) or how to store a firearm.
