House Bill 4005 attempts to punish gun owners for the dirty deeds of criminal thieves as well as individuals that may act irresponsibly after a gun is sold.

If someone steals a car and commits a crime with it, do we hold the crime victim responsible. Of course not! To do so would be absurd; however, that's exactly what this bill would do to gun owners.

In Orwellian twist, the bill also appears to punish citizens even if you do lock your guns up—making it a lose-lose situation for law-abiding gun owners that simply want to defend themselves.

Additionally, the existing reckless endangerment and child endangerment laws in Oregon should be sufficient to charge anyone that behaves dangerously.

The fact that a prosecutor may exorcisediscretion in not prosecuting these individuals or may not have enough evidence to do so is another matter entirely.

Juries that choose to convict, or not to convict under the existing law should be judicial matter—and also a matter left best to the counties that elect their own prosecutors.

Having good intentions isn't an excuse to have laws that do not engender the
