This bill responds to a problem that was unintentional. I believe Gov. Brown made a mistake in including Portland's Pearl district as an Opportunity Zone. We all make mistakes. Unfortunately this one has perturbed the Oregon Education Association. Opportunity Zones are very useful in many areas of our state, and should be used to spur smart investment. And, they usually are. This bill punishes areas that need the ability to encourage specific economic development that will improve the lives of their citizens.
