Corvallis City Council wishes to indicate its support to reduce greenhouse gas emissions through carbon pricing.

This position is supported by our city documents and recent actions:

- **Corvallis's Vision Statement:** Corvallis is a safe, sustainable, resilient, small city... that protects its natural environment, addresses a changing climate, and prepares for emergencies with special attention paid to its most vulnerable populations.
- **Corvallis Climate Action Plan:** Carbon Pricing Promote policies at the local, state and federal level that implement carbon-based fees or taxes.
- City Council **Resolution 2015-15** endorsed carbon pricing.  
Corvallis City Council voted unanimously to support the passage of HB 2020.
