Re: Legislative Review of Executive Appointments

BOARD OF MEDICAL IMAGING

The Governor has appointed the following individuals to the Board of Medical Imaging subject to Senate confirmation.¹

Appointees

Statement of Economic Interest²

Not required.

Statutory Requirements³

The board consists of 12 members appointed by the Governor and subject to confirmation by the Senate.⁴ Each member of the board must be a resident of this state. Members serve three year terms and at the pleasure of the Governor. Members of the board are entitled to compensation and expenses as provided in ORS 292.495 and the board may provide by rule for greater compensation.

One member must be a licensed physician who is in good standing and who is a radiologist (BOUCHER).

Three members must be licensed physicians who are in good standing and who apply to serve on the board in a form and manner prescribed by the board (**BIROUTI**, BRANTING, HOPKINS, KHAROTI). If the board does not receive a sufficient number of applications to fill these positions, the Governor may appoint the remaining board members from applicants who have been retired for not more than six years and who are either registered with the board as retired emeritus physicians or who provide the board with notice of retirement. If that fails to yield

sufficient applications, the Governor may appoint the remaining board members among any combination of the following:

- A licensed chiropractic physician who is certified by the American Chiropractic Board of Radiology as a Diplomate of the American Chiropractic Board of Radiology;
- An actively engaged medical imaging licensee;
- A permitted limited X-ray machine operator; or
- A member of the public.

Five members must be actively engaged medical imaging licensees. Licensee members may be selected by the Governor from a list of three to five nominees for each vacancy, submitted by a professional organization representing medical imaging licensees. Licensee members must include one from each of the following medical imaging modalities:

- Diagnostic medical sonography and all its subspecialties (COLE);
- Magnetic resonance imaging and all its subspecialties (DOWNER-VALDEZ);
- Nuclear medicine technology and all its subspecialties (BENNETT);
- Radiation therapy and all its subspecialties (BETZ); and,
- Radiography and all its subspecialties (PECK).

Three members must be members of the public (BOHLKE, KOPECKY, VOSS). Public members may not be otherwise eligible for appointment to the board or the spouse, domestic partner, child, parent or sibling of a person issued a license or permit by the board.

The section manager of the Radiation Protection Services Section of the Oregon Health Authority, or a person appointed by the section manager, is an advisory member of the board for the purpose of providing counsel and is not entitled to vote.

Duties and Authority

The board must:⁵

- Annually elect a board chairperson and a vice chairperson from the voting members of the board;
- Meet at least once every three months at times and places designated by resolution;
- Issue licenses and permits to individuals who meet the standards administered by the board;
- Adopt rules that are necessary to carry out the board's statutory mission;
- Establish by rule and collect reasonable fees for specified services;
- Approve programs of continuing education in medical imaging modalities and for limited X-ray machine operators;
- Oversee examinations given each year for a limited X-ray machine operator permit; and,
- Require each licensee and permittee to submit evidence of continuing education pertinent to the license or permit.

The board may:⁶

- Appoint and fix the compensation of an executive director and include reimbursement for actual and necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of the duties of the director;
- Require the fingerprints for the purpose of requesting a state or nationwide criminal records of license applicants, individuals under investigation, and board staff or contractors;
- Seek volunteers from the various medical imaging modalities to review and assist in the approval of continuing education credits for their respective medical imaging modalities;
- Investigate any alleged violation of the board's statutory authority and may take evidence and depositions, compel the appearance of witnesses, require answers to interrogatories, compel production of records and testimony, and require a person to undergo a mental, physical, chemical dependency or competency evaluation at the person's expense when the board has reasonable grounds to believe that the person is or may be unable to practice a medical imaging modality with reasonable skill and safety or may constitute a risk to the public;
- Form temporary peer review committees in the relevant modality or subspecialty to advise the board of appropriate disciplinary action;
- Establish by rule a process for the imposition of a fine on an individual licensed or holding a permit for an administrative or clerical violation if the violation does not create a risk of harm to the public;
- Waive license requirements for individuals with substantial experience, as determined by the board, practicing the medical imaging modality for which the waiver is sought or who performs that medical imaging modality as an employee of, or under a contract with, a rural hospital;
- Issue specified licenses and permits to individuals who meet standards administered by the board; and,
- Refuse to issue a license or permit to any applicant, may refuse to renew the license of any medical imaging licensee or permit holder or may suspend or revoke the license or permit if it makes certain findings after notice of and hearings as required under the contested case procedures.
