HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 4031

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after "health;" delete the rest of the line and delete lines 2 3 through 11.

3 In line 12, delete "813.200;".

4 Delete lines 14 through 27 and delete pages 2 through 105 and insert:

5 "<u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall prepare an assessment that forecasts 6 the supply of and demand for behavioral health professionals in this state over the next 10 7 years. The assessment must function as an evaluative and planning tool for the Legislative 8 Assembly with regard to behavioral health professionals.

9 "(2) The assessment must focus on compiling the existing work of the authority with 10 relevant previously conducted studies and relevant local and national data in order to de-11 termine specifically how to develop and improve the behavioral health workforce of this 12 state. The assessment must detail the behavioral health professionals who are currently 13 ready to enter the workforce and the need for behavioral health professionals by specific 14 types of services and professionals and must forecast the need for behavioral health profes-15 sionals in 10 years.

16 "(3) In addition to the requirements described in subsection (2) of this section, the as-17 sessment must:

"(a) Specifically identify any current gaps in the behavioral health workforce and the
 ability of the workforce to meet the needs of this state;

20 "(b) Determine the number and type of behavioral health professionals who are currently 21 completing educational programs, obtaining licensure or other authorization to practice and 22 entering the workforce, and determine the number of unlicensed behavioral health profes-23 sionals entering into the workforce or expanding their scopes of practice;

24 "(c) Include results from consultation with the Department of Education, the Higher 25 Education Coordinating Commission and relevant health professional regulatory boards in 26 this state to determine relevant information for the assessment; and

"(d) Identify and evaluate any barriers to meeting the current goals for the behavioral
health workforce, and make recommendations that clearly articulate strategies to remove
or overcome barriers.

"(4) Health professional regulatory boards and state agencies that regulate any behavioral health professionals, and public institutions of higher education and technical schools that offer educational programs related to behavioral health, shall cooperate with the authority as requested by the authority for purposes of the assessment described in this section.

35 "(5) Not later than November 1, 2020, the authority shall submit the assessment de-

1 scribed in this section, and any recommendations for legislation, to an interim committee

2 of the Legislative Assembly related to behavioral health.

3 "<u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2020 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2020
4 regular session of the Eightieth Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.".

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
