## House Bill 4066

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Energy and Environment for Representative Karin Power)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Authorizes Public Utility Commission to allow electric companies to recover costs for prudent investments or expenses in infrastructure measures that support adoption of electric vehicles if certain criteria are met.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the Public Utility Commission; and declaring an emergency.

**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2020 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 757.

5 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) As used in this section, "electric company" has the meaning given that 6 term in ORS 757.600.

7 (2) The Public Utility Commission may allow an electric company to recover costs from 8 all ratepayers for prudent investments or expenses in infrastructure measures, including 9 infrastructure measures behind the meter, that support the adoption and service of electric 10 vehicles if the investments are consistent with and meet the requirements of subsection (3) 11 of this section.

(3) An investment in infrastructure measures that support the adoption and service of
electric vehicles is a utility service and a benefit to utility ratepayers if the investment can
be reasonably anticipated to:

15 (a) Support reductions of transportation sector greenhouse gas emissions over time; and

(b) Benefit the electric company's ratepayers in ways that may include, but need not be
limited to:

18 (A) Distribution or transmission management benefits;

(B) Revenues to utilities from electric vehicle charging to offset utilities' fixed costs that
may otherwise be charged to ratepayers;

(C) System efficiencies or other economic values inuring to the benefit of ratepayers over
the long term; or

23 (D) Increased ratepayer choice through provision of greater transportation electrification

infrastructure deployment to increase availability of and access to public and private electric
vehicle charging stations.

26 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2020 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 27 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2020 Act takes effect 28 on its passage.

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
