

## HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 5203

By JOINT COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after the first semicolon delete the rest of the line and delete line  
2 3 and insert “creating new provisions; amending sections 3, 6, 7, 8, 10, 13, 13a and 16, chapter 670,  
3 Oregon Laws 2019; and declaring an emergency.”.

4 Delete lines 5 through 20 and insert:

5 “**SECTION 1.** Section 3, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to read:

6 “**Sec. 3.** The following amounts are allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, from the  
7 Administrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Oregon Business Development Depart-  
8 ment, for the following purposes:

10 (1) **Operations**..... \$ **9,078,635**

11 (2) Business, innovation

12 [*and trade*..... \$ 57,965,174]

13 **and trade**..... \$ **64,729,941**

21 “**SECTION 2.** Section 6, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to read:

22 “**Sec. 6.** There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, from the Administrative  
23 Services Economic Development Fund, to the office of the Governor, the amount of [~~\$3,932,736~~]  
24 **\$4,106,514** for expenses of the Regional Solutions Program.

25 “**SECTION 3.** Section 7, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to read:

26 “**Sec. 7.** (1) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall establish a process for al-  
27 locating available moneys in the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund on a quar-  
28 terly basis to fulfill the biennial allocations made by sections 1 to 12a [*of this 2019 Act*], **chapter**  
29 **670, Oregon Laws 2019**. The department shall set the quarterly allocations.

30 “(2) If, in any quarter, the moneys transferred from the State Lottery Fund to the Administrative  
31 Services Economic Development Fund are insufficient to pay for the quarterly allocations made by  
32 sections 1 to 12a [*of this 2019 Act*], **chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019**, or any other 2019 Act, prior  
33 to making any other allocations pursuant to sections 1 to 12a [*of this 2019 Act*], **chapter 670,**  
34 **Oregon Laws 2019**, the department shall satisfy lottery bond debt service obligations in the amount  
35 of [~~\$263,661,510~~] **\$260,972,723** for outstanding lottery bonds.

1 “(3) After the lottery bond debt service obligations described in subsection (2) of this section  
2 are satisfied, if the remaining moneys transferred from the State Lottery Fund to the Administrative  
3 Services Economic Development Fund are insufficient to pay for the quarterly allocations made by  
4 sections 1 to 12a [of this 2019 Act], **chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019**, the department shall reduce  
5 the quarterly allocations not described in subsection (2) of this section proportionately in amounts  
6 sufficient to accommodate the revenue shortfall.

7 “**SECTION 4.** Section 8, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to read:

8 “**Sec. 8.** There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, from the Administrative  
9 Services Economic Development Fund, to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, the  
10 amount of [~~\$263,661,510~~] **\$260,972,723** for the purpose of paying, when due, the principal, interest and  
11 premium, if any, on outstanding lottery bonds, as described in section 7 [of this 2019 Act], **chapter**  
12 **670, Oregon Laws 2019.**

13 “**SECTION 5.** Section 10, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to read:

14 “**Sec. 10.** Notwithstanding and in lieu of the requirement in ORS 461.549 (2) for a percentage-  
15 based transfer of moneys, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, the amount allocated from the  
16 Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Problem Gambling Treatment Fund is  
17 [~~\$14,593,071~~] **\$14,687,792.**

18 “**SECTION 6.** Section 13, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to read:

19 “**Sec. 13.** There are allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, from the Veterans’ Ser-  
20 vices Fund, to the Veterans’ Department of Veterans’ Affairs Dedicated Lottery Fund, the following  
21 amounts for the following purposes:

29 “**SECTION 7.** Section 13a, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to read:

30 “**Sec. 13a.** There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, from the Veterans’ Ser-  
31 vices Fund, to the Bureau of Labor and Industries, the amount of [~~\$250,000~~] **\$260,230** for the purpose  
32 of implementing the provisions of [section 1, chapter 528, Oregon Laws 2019 (Enrolled House Bill  
33 2202)] **ORS 660.220.**

34 “**SECTION 8.** There is allocated for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, from the  
35 **Veterans’ Services Fund established under ORS 406.140, to the Long Term Care Ombudsman,**  
36 **the amount of \$391,302 for the Oregon Public Guardian and Conservator to provide public**  
37 **guardian and conservator services exclusively to veterans.**

38 “**SECTION 9.** Notwithstanding section 44, chapter 355, Oregon Laws 2019, for the  
39 **biennium ending June 30, 2021, the amount transferred by the Oregon Department of Ad-**  
40 **ministrative Services from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the**  
41 **Employer Incentive Fund pursuant to section 44, chapter 355, Oregon Laws 2019, may not**  
42 **exceed \$5,405,177.**

43 “**SECTION 10.** Section 16, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to read:

44 “**Sec. 16.** There are allocated to the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training for the  
45 biennium beginning July 1, 2019, from the Criminal Fine Account, the following amounts for the

1 following purposes:

- 2 (1) Criminal justice training  
3 [and standards operations..... \$ 31,999,031]  
4 **and standards operations..... \$ 34,699,952**  
5 (2) Public Safety Memorial Fund ..... \$ 279,495

6 **“SECTION 11. This 2020 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**  
7 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2020 Act takes effect**  
8 **on its passage.”**

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
