PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 4001

In line 2 of the printed bill, after "housing;" insert "amending ORS 446.265 and 458.650;".

3 After line 2, insert:

Whereas high rents, high home prices and a lack of available housing
are causing housing instability and homelessness to increase rapidly; and

6 "Whereas higher rates of unsheltered homelessness on the west coast of 7 the United States can be attributed to lack of shelter capacity, rising costs 8 of rental housing, stagnant incomes for low-wage workers and a decline in 9 federal support for affordable housing; and

"Whereas more than 64 percent of people experiencing homelessness in
 Oregon are unsheltered; and

"Whereas Oregon has the highest rate of unsheltered family homelessnessin the nation; and

14 "Whereas shelter beds alleviate the acute trauma of unsheltered15 homelessness; and

"Whereas urgent and emergency measures are warranted to address thiscrisis; now, therefore,".

18 Delete lines 4 through 7 and insert:

"SECTION 1. Sections 2 and 3 of this 2020 Act and ORS 446.265 are
 added to and made a part of ORS chapter 197.

21 "SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section and section 3 of this 2020

Act, 'emergency shelter' means a building that provides shelter on a temporary basis for individuals and families who lack permanent housing.

"(2) A building acquired, constructed or rehabilitated for use as an
emergency shelter under an approval granted under section 3 of this
2020 Act may not be used for any purpose other than as an emergency
shelter except upon application for a permit demonstrating that the
construction of the building and its use could be approved under current land use laws and local land use regulations.

10 "<u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) The governing body of a local government shall 11 approve an application for the development or use of land for an 12 emergency shelter on any lot or parcel, notwithstanding ORS chapter 13 195, 197, 197A, 215 or 227 or any statewide plan, rule of the Land Con-14 servation and Development Commission or local land use regulation, 15 zoning ordinance, regional framework plan, functional plan or com-16 prehensive plan, if the emergency shelter:

17 "(a) Includes sleeping and restroom facilities for residents;

18 **"(b) Will comply with applicable building codes;**

"(c) Has adequate transportation access to commercial and medical
 services;

"(d) Has had its design and operation plans reviewed and approved
 as not posing any identifiable concern to public health or safety by:

"(A) The local health department, as defined in ORS 431.003; and
"(B) The State Fire Marshal, a deputy state fire marshal or a person
acting for a governmental subdivision described in ORS 476.030;

26 "(e) Will be operated by:

"(A) A public benefit corporation, as defined in ORS 65.001, whose
charitable purpose includes the support of homeless individuals, that
has been recognized as exempt from income tax under section 501(a)
of the Internal Revenue Code on or before January 1, 2017 and that

has at least three years experience operating emergency shelters using
best practices;

"(B) A religious corporation, as defined in ORS 65.001, that has at
least three years experience operating emergency shelters using best
practices;

6 "(C) A local government as defined in ORS 174.116; or

"(D) A nonprofit corporation partnering with any other entity described in this paragraph.

9 "(2) An emergency shelter approved under this section:

"(a) May provide on-site for its residents and at no cost to the res idents:

- 12 "(A) Showering or bathing;
- 13 **"(B) Storage for personal property;**
- 14 "(C) Laundry facilities;
- 15 "(D) Service of food prepared on-site or off-site;

16 "(E) Recreation areas for children and pets;

"(F) Case management services for housing, financial, vocational,
 educational or physical or behavioral health care services; or

19 "(G) Any other services incidental to shelter.

"(b) May include youth shelters, winter or warming shelters, day
 shelters and family violence shelter homes as defined in ORS 409.290.

"(3) The approval of an emergency shelter under this section is not
a land use decision and is subject to review only under ORS 34.010 to
34.100.

25 "SECTION 4. Section 3 of this 2020 Act is repealed on July 1, 2021.
26 "SECTION 5. ORS 446.265 is amended to read:

"446.265. (1) Inside an urban growth boundary, a local government may authorize the establishment of transitional housing accommodations used as individual living units by one or more individuals. Use of transitional housing accommodations is limited to [*persons*] **individuals** who lack permanent

or safe shelter and who cannot be placed in other low income housing. A
local government may limit the maximum amount of time that an individual
or a family may use the accommodations.

"(2) Transitional housing accommodations are intended to be used by in-4 dividuals or families on a limited basis for seasonal, emergency or transi- $\mathbf{5}$ tional housing purposes and may include yurts, huts, cabins, fabric 6 structures, tents and similar accommodations, as well as areas in parking 7 lots or facilities for individuals or families to reside overnight in a 8 motor vehicle, without regard to whether the motor vehicle was de-9 signed for use as temporary living quarters. The transitional housing 10 accommodations may provide parking facilities, walkways and access to wa-11 ter, toilet, shower, laundry, cooking, telephone or other services either 12 through separate or shared facilities. The Oregon Health Authority may de-13 velop public health best practices for shared health and sanitation facilities 14 for transitional housing accommodations. 15

"(3) Transitional housing accommodations are not subject to ORS chapter90.

"(4) As used in this section, 'yurt' means a round, domed tent of canvas or other weather resistant material, having a rigid framework, wooden floor, one or more windows or skylights and that may have plumbing, electrical service or heat.

²³ "458.650. (1) The Emergency Housing Account [*shall be*] **is** administered ²⁴ by the Housing and Community Services Department to assist homeless per-²⁵ sons and those persons who are at risk of becoming homeless. An amount ²⁶ equal to 25 percent of moneys deposited in the account pursuant to ORS ²⁷ 294.187 is dedicated for expenditure for assistance to veterans who are ²⁸ homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. For purposes of this section, 'ac-²⁹ count' means the Emergency Housing Account.

30 "(2) The Oregon Housing Stability Council, with the advice of the Com-

munity Action Partnership of Oregon, shall develop policy for awarding
grants to organizations that shall use the funds:

"(a) To provide to low and very low income persons, including but not
limited to, persons more than 65 years of age, persons with disabilities,
farmworkers and Native Americans:

6 "(A) Emergency shelters and attendant services;

"(B) Transitional housing services designed to assist persons to make the
transition from homelessness to permanent housing and economic independence;

"(C) Supportive housing services to enable persons to continue living in their own homes or to provide in-home services for such persons for whom suitable programs do not exist in their geographic area;

"(D) Programs that provide emergency payment of home payments, rents
 or utilities; or

"(E) Some or all of the needs described in subparagraphs (A) to (D) of thisparagraph.

"(b) To align with federal strategies and resources that are available toprevent and end homelessness.

"(3)(a) The council shall require as a condition of awarding a grant that the organization demonstrate to the satisfaction of the council that the organization has the capacity to deliver any service proposed by the organization.

"(b) Any funds granted under this section [*shall*] **may** not be used to replace existing funds. Funds granted under this section may be used to supplement existing funds. An organization may use funds to support existing programs or to establish new programs.

"(c) The council, by policy, shall give preference in granting funds to
those organizations that receive grants from the Housing Development Grant
Program established under ORS 458.625.

30 "(4) The department may expend funds from the account for:

"(a) The administration of the account as provided for in the legislatively
approved budget, as that term is defined in ORS 291.002, for the department.
"(b) The development of technical assistance and training resources
for organizations developing and operating emergency shelters as defined in section 2 of this 2020 Act and transitional housing accommodations as described in ORS 446.265.

"(d) Short-term rental assistance for individuals or families transi tioning from homelessness to permanent housing.

"(3) In awarding grants and providing technical assistance under
 this section, the department shall:

"(a) Ensure that funds are distributed among different regions of
 the state through a competitive process that emphasizes collaborative

1 proposals; and

"(b) Prioritize investment on areas of highest need as identified in
the Oregon Statewide Shelter Study.

4 "SECTION 9. Section 8 of this 2020 Act is repealed on January 2,
5 2022.

"SECTION 10. (1) As used in this section, 'navigation center' means
a low-barrier emergency shelter, as defined in section 8 of this 2020
Act, that is open seven days per week and connects individuals and
families with health services, permanent housing and public benefits.

"(2) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, out of the General Fund, for distribution to cities to conduct or contract for predevelopment planning, construction, purchase or lease of property that will be used for navigation centers, the amount of:

16 "(a) \$2,000,000 for distribution to the City of Bend;

17 "(b) \$4,000,000 for distribution to the City of Salem; and

 this 2020 Act;

25 "(2) \$8,000,000, to award grants under section 8 (2)(d) of this 2020 26 Act; and

"(3) \$2,000,000, to develop and provide technical assistance under
ORS 458.650 (4)(b) and section 8 of this 2020 Act.".
